Noah Burleson Farm SR 1249

The tidy Noah Burleson farmhouse was once the nucleus of a farmstead that is being encroached on by



Albemarle's outlying residential area. Built in two sections, the weatherboarded dwelling consists of two selfcontained, side-gabled units joined by a hyphen. Each unit has a hipped roof porch with square posts and a square post balustrade. The foundation of the front porch has a latticework border.

Noah Burleson built the original section facing the Canton Church Road between 1880 and 1890. By this time he had begun a family with his wife Frona and had a modest farm consisting of 35 tilled acres. When he took over the farm around 1910, Noah's son Homer and his wife Ethel added the second section. It is identical to the first section on the exterior, but on the interior has a hall and parlor floor plan. A chimney of hand-molded bricks stands at the east gable end of the newer section; the west gable end of the older section has a replacement flue chimney.

Soon after he took over the farm, Homer started a chicken farm — one of the first in this region of the county. In the 1950's, Homer's son Retha and his wife Lois expanded the chicken farm and built a feed mill for their livestock.
