



Howell was the fourth son of William "Billie" and Sarah Harwood Burleyson of Little Bear Creek. On June 10, 1864 he was conscripted in the Junior Reserves to serve in North Carolina's defense. He was described as 5 foot 9 inches in height with blue eyes and fair complexion.

This 17-year-old fought in battles in Eastern North Carolina but in 1864 the war was not going well for the South and Howell was transferred to Virginia on December 20. He served in the 20th Regiment, Iverson's Brigade. The 20th was part of General Lee's Army of Northern Virginia. They served the Petersburg line until April 2, 1865 when the Union troops crushed the defenses and Richmond fell.

Howell returned home at age 18, a true veteran and ready to restart his life in Stanly County. In 1870 he was married to Judith Burris Almond, a widow of the War. They raised a large respected family and Howell and Judith were well known in the Canton Church area for their kindness and help to all of their neighbors. John Hoyle Burleson


Notes for JUDITH "JUDIE" BURRIS ALMOND:

Mrs. Judith Burleyson, widow of the late Mr. Howell Burleyson, died at her home in the vicinity four miles west of Albemarle on Saturday, January 19, at 9.45 p. m. For sometime she had been suffering from the effects of a cancerous growth, but only a short time before her death she contracted a severe case of pneumonia, which hastened the end. Her condition early in the day Saturday gave hopes for recovery; but a sudden change for the worse caused her death to come as a surprise and shock to family and friends, and she was unconscious when some members of the family hastened to her bedside just before her demise.

The burial took place at Canton Baptist church on Monday it 11 A.M., services conducted by Rev. A. C. Davis of Olive Branch, assisted by Rev. P. P. Walker of the local Baptist church. One of the largest crowds ever assembled at Canton church gathered to witness the last rites over the remains of a beloved friend and neighbor. The deceased was born in this county on November 23, 1840, when the county formed a portion of Montgomery. She was twice married, her first husband, Mr. John Almond, having died early in the War Between the States. To this union, one son survives, Mr. James Almond. Eight sons and daughters were born to the second six of whom survive, Messrs.

U.S., I.R., A.L. and D.R. Burleyson, and Mrs. Wm B. Almond and Mrs. Charles Burleyson, all of the county. Messrs. I.R. and A.L. Burleyson are highly respected citizens of our town.

The deceased, was all of "Mother" to her, children, and her great heart took in neighbors and their children, towards whom she could newer fully express her love, and it is in a multitude of kind ministrations in which she distributed joy to others that she will be best remembered. She was a Christian from youth, and death held no sorrows for her other than the parting with those she loved here on earth. A member of the Baptist faith, she was a loyal devoted member to her church. There is an element of pleasure mingled with the sorrow one always, feels over the death of a person whose life has proved a blessing to others when chronicles of this nature are made out, and the Enterprise can hold out no greater consolation to the bereaved members of the family in a loss which they so potently feel at this time than comes from a memory of the sweet life which is left them as a heritage and an inspiration to so live that again they will see Mother and join her in the Great Beyond.



Notes for WILLIAM (BILLIE) BURLESON:

GrandPa Billie as he was known on Canton Road was quite a character. Almost all the older Burlesons remember him and they all have stories passed down about him. He raised two families. His first wife was Sarah Harwood. They raised seven known children, two girls and five boys. Sarah died sometime prior to 1860.

William (Billie) Burleson was conscripted on April 10, 1864 into the 34th NC, part of Scale's Brigade. Billie had three sons already in the service: Absolem in the 10th Artillery, Ebin in the 28th NC, and Isaac in the 42nd NC. Howell would follow in June 1864, He was a 51 year old widower with seven children when he was taken prisoner on 6 May 1864 in the opening battles of the Wilderness Campaign. Billie returned home at the end of the war to be united with his four oldest sons, all hardened veterans of the war. He married Rhoda Springer and raised seven more children. By JD Burleson

Men of the William "Billie" Burleson Family That Served North Carolina

William "Billie" Burleson was born in 1812 on the Little Bear Creek in the Western part of Montgomery County that is now known as Stanly County. Billie's grandfather, Isaac, was given this land for his service in the fight for American Independence. Isaac received 100 acres for serving as an infantryman for North Carolina.

The leaders of Stanly County anticipated the War Between the States. They raised a company of infantry for State Service two weeks before North Carolina seceded. Billie's two younger brothers, Lee and Nathan, would join the first day and both would die in the war.

Before the war concluded at Appomattox, every Burleson listed as "Head of Household" in the 1860 census from Stanly County and their sons of age served our Confederate States of America.

In February 1862, Billie's third oldest son Isaac, age 20, volunteered in Company C 42nd Infantry. He would serve North Carolina and the Army of Northern Virginia.

In March of 1862 Billie's second oldest son Ebin, age 22 volunteered for Company K of the 28th Infantry. In August 1862 the oldest son Absalom, volunteered for the Artillery. Billie himself was conscripted in April 1864 to Scales Brigade.

<u>The fourth oldest son, Howell, age 16, was conscripted in June 1864 into the 70th Regiment of Junior Reserves.</u>

Billie's two daughters were both married to husbands who served our South. William Hatley enlisted at age 22 years in March 1862 into Company C 42nd Infantry. Daniel Bowers was conscripted into Company F 5th North Carolina. This left only the youngest son William Jr., age 13, at home to protect and provide for the seven families whose heads of household were gone to war. Absalom Burleyson Company B 10th North Carolina Heavy Artillery

Absalom was the son of William "Billie" and Sarah Harwood Burleyson of Little Bear Creek in Stanly County. Both Billie's and Sarah's Grandfathers fought in the American Revolution. Absalom volunteered for the Artillery on August 9, 1862. His service was in coastal defense of North Carolina until November 1864 when they were sent to Georgia to oppose Sherman's March to the Sea. The 10th was at camp in Bush Hill, Randolph County on April 29, 1865 almost three weeks after General Lee's surrender.

My in-depth study of Absalom's record reveals the stress of the times. The ever-present fear of being killed in any action was always there. For all soldiers death from disease was more prevalent, the individual had very little control. Peer pressure alone made every soldier meet these challenges. Families back home were the most important thoughts for all the North Carolina soldiers. Absalom was one of these.

Absalom enlisted at the time wife Sarah Anne Sides Harwood was six-months pregnant with daughter Minnie who was born on February 20, 1863. In June he came home on a 10-day furlough, but stayed several months. Upon returning to the Army he was placed under arrest where he faced a chance of the firing squad, but was returned to service October 1, 1863. His second daughter, Jane Alice, was born June 7, 1864.

Absalom's biggest battle against Sherman was at Averysboro, an artillery dual, and the battle at Bentonville that sealed the fate of the Confederate States. He returned home to see a daughter he had seen only one time and a new daughter age ten months he had never seen before.

The war's end brought home many veterans like Absalom. The real heroes are the wives and family. I am proud to be a great grandson of Absalom and Sarah Anne. By John Hoyle Burleyson

Notes for SARAH ANN SIDES: Sarah Ann Sides was the only child of Charlie and Betsy Almond Sides. After Sarah's birth, I can find no record of Betsy. Infact, I can find no record of her before this. She fits into no other Almond line I can find. My only knowledge of Betsy comes from my Grandfather, John F. Burleson, when he records Charlie Sides and Betsy Almond as parents of Sarah Ann, his mother on her death certificate.

Did Betsy die in child birth? This is very possible. We do know that Charlie married Sophis Lyerly on November 17, 1844, the daughter of Jacob and Mary Moose Lyerly. From this union came 10 more children.

As you can see the Sides family was always in Sarah's mind and heart. The Sides family was also in the mind and heart of the Burleson family. From the 11 Sides children two Burleson brothers, Absalom and Eben, would marry sisters Sarah and Mary. Nephew Hurley would marry Lillie.


Sarah would also name her children after her brother and sisters, Frances, Attie and William Columbus(this was passed on to a son Guy and Mildred Burleson).

Our Harwood connection must be documented also. Absalom Harwood who after his service in the American Revolution settled on Bear Creek and became the first Harwood to establish a link to the Burlesons in Stanly County. His son Howell married Celia and they had 13 children. The oldest Sarah, married William Billie Burleson, and son, Absalom, would marry Billie's sister Dovey.

These two couples (Burleson and Harwood) honored their spouse's family by naming their children after them. We find Absalom, Eben, Howell Burleson and Isaac, William, Davidson Harwood.

The third connection, Davidson, who was the youngest child of Howell and Celia Harwood. We find Davidson a Deputy Sheriff of Stanly County in 1860 with his wife Sara Anne and child Frances. In 1861 a son, David B., was born. We do not know what happened to Davidson, but we know that Absalom Burleson and Sara Anne Sides Harwood took up housekeeping and had 10 children.Written by John H. This is a article that was published in the Parapet, a newletter put out by the Point Lookout POW Org. Nov/Dec 1999.

Ebin Burleson lived in Stanly County, NC. He had fair complexion, red hair, blue eyes and was five and a half feet tall. At age 24, he fought in all of Lee's campaigns beginning on March 15, 1862. Ebin even witnessed his company's regimental flag being taken at the wall by the 126^{th} NY Inf. It was during that battle that cousin J. Benjamin Burleson, 37^{th} NC Infantry, left on the field, wounded for the third time (once in the hand at Fredericksburg), was captured and sent to Point Lookout POW camp. Uncle Joseph Burleson was captured at Harrisonburg, VA (after being shot in the right thigh 6 days prior at Winchester); cousin David Derrick Burleson, 5th NC Inf, was captured at Cedar Creek; cousin John Wesley Burleson, 28th NC Inf, was captured at Waterloo, cousin William Burleson, 42nd NC Inf, was captured at Cold Harbor...all sent to Point Lookout! William died after a transfer to Elmira Prison. On April 2, 1865 Ebin was captured at Petersburg. He too, was sent to Point Lookout POW Camp until his release on June 23, 1865. Ebin and his relatives were true Southerners. His father, known as Grandpa Billie was conscripted because of the shortage of men in 1864 at the age of 52! He also had four brothers, Absolem, Isaac, and Howell to serve the CSA. Several of the teenage Burleson cousins were registered with Junior Reserves! In 1893, Ebin married nineteen year old Dora Hopkins and they had eight children. The last baby girl was born on April 4, 1914 and they named her Dallie Mae. Dallie Mae Burleson Moore is our latest PLPOW Real Daughter! Ebin farmed all his life and lived to be 89 years old. He is buried in a private family cemetery in Stanly Co NC. Last month, the Burlesons hosted a family reunion, with over one hundred in attendance. A program was presented, highlighting their family members who had served in The War Between The States. At this time, John D. Burleson, Ebin's great grandson, adorned with his PLPOW medal with four stars, presented 85 year old Dallie Mae with her PLPOW Real Daughter certificate! Dallie Mae will receive a free lifetime membership in our Descendants Organization.

The Burleson Family have discover that their ancestors have been true patriots for over 200 years, starting with American Revolution in the NC milita during our first war for Independence, all the way down to present day. Last year, they honored all 65 of their Burleson's who had been WWII veterans.

There's nothing like family pride and preserving your family's heritage for the present generation and for those who'll follow in your footsteps when you're gone. We need to do as this family has done....tell and show our children!

Ebin Burleson Private Company K, 28th North Carolina Troops Branch/Lane Brigade

Ebin Burleson was born January 11, 1839, the son of William (Grand-paw Billie) and Sarah Harwood Burleson. He was a farmer and a life long resident of Stanly County and made his home on Burleson Road. According to his military records, he had fair complexion, red hair, blue eyes and was five and a half feet tall. At age 24, he enlisted for the war on March 15, 1862 and fought in all of Lee's campaigns. Ebin was a member of Company K. 28th NC Regiment which was part of the Branch/Lane Brigade. He witnessed his companies' regimental flag being taken at he wall by the 126th NY Inf. It was during that battle that cousin J. Benjamin Burleson, 37th NC Infantry, left on the field, wounded for the third time (once in the hand at Fredericksburg), was captured

and sent to Point Lookout POW camp.

On April 2, 1865 Ebin was captured at Petersburg. He too, was sent to Point Lookout POW Camp until his release on June 23, 1865. Family tradition says Ebin was starved half to death and was almost blind when he arrived home. It took several years for him to recover.

Ebin was active in Stanly County's reunions of Confederate Veterans. He died at the age of 89 on January 27, 1927, and was buried at Burleson Cemetery #2 on Parker Road in Stanly County, NC, where he rests today with his wife Dora Hopkins Burleson. John D. (JD) Burleson

Isaac was the third son of William "Billie" and Sarah Harwood Burleyson of Little Bear Creek in Stanly County. He enlisted into the Confederate Army on February 1, 1862. His service started as a prison guard at Salisbury and ended at Bennett's Place in May 1865. This included service with the Army of Northern Virginia.

The 42nd saw action in the Eastern part of North Carolina in 1862 and 1863. In 1864 the 42nd, Hoke's Brigade, was sent to defend Richmond. General Grant suffered greatly in his attack at Cold Harbor against Hoke's Brigade.

The 42^{nd} was positioned in the center and all other regiments were aligned to the left and right of the 42^{nd} at Bentonville. This was the very last battle to stop Sherman's much larger army.

Isaac gave his service in full measure from February 1862 until the final Confederate surrender and the disbanding of the 42^{nd} on May 2, 1865 at Center Church in Randolph County.

Isaac returned to Stanly County after the war to marry Mary Hearne and there they raised their family and helped to rebuild their community. Today they lay in rest in the family graveyard on Burleson Road.



Joseph Burleyson was the son of Isaac Jr. and Katherine Castle Burleyson. He was a life-long resident of Stanly County and made his home in the Little Bear Creek area. Joseph and his wife, Lucy Almond, raised three sons that fought for the Confederate Army. The oldest son, William, was a member of Company C 42nd Regiment and died as a prisoner at Elmira, New York. The middle son, John, died from disease while a member of Company H 14th Regiment, according to the pension records of Stanly County. Dennis was conscripted at age 16 into the 70th Regiment, but survived the war.

Joseph, age 41, was conscripted in March1864 into Company K 57th Regiment, General Jubal Early's Division, but on August 31 at Winchester, he was shot through the hip and captured. After hospitalization in Baltimore and Yankee prison at Point Lookout, Joseph returned to Stanly County after he was released. He raised a large family.

My records show that Joseph was never paid his eleven dollars a month pay as a private because of his wounding and capture, but he surely paid a high price for the Southern Cause. He lost his brothers, Lee and Nathan, and his two oldest sons, William and John.

Years later, he was active in Stanly County's reunions of Confederate Veterans. He died at age 80 on February 24, 1902, and was buried at Friendship Methodist Church in Plyler, where this soldier rests today. John Hoyle Burleson

Lee was the son of Isaac Jr. and Catherine Castle Burleyson and joined the first company raised in Stanly County. Lee survived his service in the Army of Northern Virginia for his one-year enlistment in Company H 14th North Carolina. While he was in Virginia he was refused re-enlistment because of being over aged at the age of 35. Lee believed in our Southern cause and later enlisted in a Virginia Artillery unit. This unit would later become part of the 13th North Carolina Light Artillery. Serving with the 13th in Weldon, North Carolina, Lee became ill and died on October 15, 1864 of fever. This warrior served a year in the thickest of battle and was discharged, but wanted to get back in the fight. He was a true warrior who gave his all!

Back home, the oldest son of Lee and Elizabeth Almond Burleyson, Adam, was conscripted into the Junior Reserves. Adam was stationed at Weldon as part of the 1st Junior Reserves during the same time his father, Lee, died in the Weldon hospital. On this day Adam enlisted at the age of 17 into the 28th Lane's Brigade that was in action in Virginia. He would fight until forced to surrender at Appomattox. Lee and Elizabeth's children grew up and raised families of their own in the Endy Community.

Nathan was the youngest son of Isaac Jr. and Catherine Burleson of Little Bear Creek.

When the first call to arms came to Stanly County on May 5, 1861, Nathan said good-bye to his wife Martha Jane Hatley and daughter to fight for our State. Nathan fought in the early battles of the war in the Army of Northern Virginia under Joseph Johnston and Robert E. Lee. The 14th North Carolina would serve under leaders such as D. H. Hill, Stephen Ramseur, Robert Rodes, and Cox. The 14th would be a contender for the most used and reliable regiment of the War. They were awarded their regimental colors by General Longstreet.

Nathan's service came to an end after being wounded and on June 16, 1863 he died at Camp Winder Hospital in Richmond, Virginia. He would not return to Stanly County or his young family.

Who is Isaac Burleson, Sr.

By JD Burleson

Isaac Burleson was the founder of the line which resulted in most of the Burlesons of Stanly County. We know the following about him. He served his country in the American Revolution as a member of Captain Charles Polk's Company of the North Carolina Militia. Records proving his service are contained in Record Group 93 (# 461) in the National Archives. Most of his service was in the Cross Creek (Fayetteville) area of the state, helping put down uprising Tory, or Loyalist, forces who continued to support King George. In 1785, following the Revolutionary War, the United States awarded ISAAC BURLESON, 100 acres of land along the Yadkin River in Montgomery County, probably as a reward for his services at Cross Creek

It is believed that Isaac was born either in Lunenburg Co., Virginia or Cumberland Co., North Carolina around 1750. ISAAC'S name first appears on a tax list in Montgomery Co. (now Stanly) in 1782. In the

1790 Census, he is shown as a resident of Montgomery County, with a wife, Martha Clay and three children; Isaac Jr. age 10, Jonathan age 8, and Rachel (infant). Tradition says ISAAC'S wife, the former Martha Clay, was related to Henry Clay, the outspoken Kentucky senator.

Isaac and Martha went on to produce five more children; Jane, David, Joseph, an unknown child, and Thomas. Each of these children is another story in itself.

On Nov 5, 1794, Isaac Burleson recorded his purchase of 100 acres of land on Little Bear Creek about 300 yards below the mouth of Running Branch. This is according to Montgomery County land entries, file number 1033, grant book 94, page 80. The 1800 Census shows ISAAC BURLESON to be a man more than 45 years of age, with his wife between 26 and 45, three male and five female children. A land grant to ISAAC BURLESON in November, 1815, file number 1870, grant book 125, page 386, mentions the property of ISAAC BURLESON deceased as a line mark, so by this time ISAAC had died and his son was receiving the grant.








Dennis Clay Ross's Stone Old Union Cemetery

Selected Stories about our Burleson Family

As related by John Hoyle Burleson at our BFRG Meeting March 6, 2000.

Isaac Burleson Sr.

My Father, Uncles and my Grandmother, Ada Burleson, told all of us grandchildren the story of three Burleson brothers. If I ever heard any names they were forgotten years ago because I failed to write them down.

The tradition goes something like this:

One of these brothers got into trouble and was under arrest. The other two broke him out of jail and they all left the county. Of the three brothers, one would go to the Western Mountains, one would go towards the South, and one would settle here in Stanly County on property he had seen once before while traveling to record an earlier land deed. My father, Taft Burleson, said several times that this Burleson lived near what is now Indian Trail, North Carolina. I remember even riding down to look for that area one day when I was six or seven you don't pay too much attention and when you're a teenager you don't listen because you already know more than your parents do. I'm over fifty now and want to write down everything I can for my grandchildren.

Let me quote you from William S. Burleson, founder of the Burleson Association in his 1983 letter to Beulah Way a Great Granddaughter of Isaac Sr. and you decide if it agrees with tradition that was passed down to me.

The Father of your Isaac Burleson Sr. is not known for sure. Most Burleson historians, past and present, have believed he was the son of John Burleson, who was killed during the American Revolutionary War. According to family tradition, John did leave a family. David Burleson, 1755-1835, is said to be another son of John. He died in Rutherford County, Tennessee and his descendants migrated to Northern Alabama, then to Texas. The estate of Aaron Burleson was probated in Wilkes County, Georgia in December 1783. Since he fits into no other family, We believe he was also son of John and a brother of your Isaac.

What we do know about Isaac Sr. is this: all Burlesons from Stanly County are descended from one man, Isaac Sr. He did have at least on brother named David that also lived in Stanly County, but he moved to Tennessee along with all his sons in the early I 800's. Isaac appears in Montgomery County (now Stanly County) on the 1782 tax list as living on Little Bear Creek. The first document we have on Isaac in Stanly is 100 acre land deed on Little Bear Creek filed in 17 79. This was probably his pension for his service in the American Revolution.

Isaac Sr. was married to Martha and they had at least five sons. First is Isaac Jr. who stayed in Stanly County, Jonathan who moved to Union County, NC, David who moved to Mississippi, Joseph who also stayed in Stanly County, and Thomas who moved to Missouri. They also had at least one daughter, Jane who married William Castle and moved to Mississippi.

We know Isaac Sr. died between 18 10 and I 8 12 and is buried in a cemetery located near Dusty Road in the Lambert Community of Stanly County, NC.

Isaac Burleson JR.

Isaac Jr. purchased land adjoining Isaac Sr.'s on Little Bear Creek. He married Catherine Castle the daughter of Thomas Castle, a Rev. War veteran, and she inherited her fathers land on Little Bear Creek when Thomas Castle left this area to settle in Mississippi. His son William who married Jane Burleson (Isaac Jr.'s sister) and Thomas' daughter Mary Ann who was married to David Burleson all left this area with Thomas Castle to settle in Mississippi also.

"Recollections"

With A. Paul Bass Jr. by J.D. Burleson

On Sunday May 13, 2001 I meet with Paul Bass Jr. and his wife, Eveley. We went to the Burleson Cemetery #2 on Parker Road and visited the gravesite of Ebin & Dora Hopkins Burleson. They are Paul's grandparents and my great-grandparents. We also visited the cemetery site of Isaac Burleson Sr. Paul showed me where Ebin & Dora's farm was located -- a big oak tree was the only landmark left to show exactly where it was. From that Oak tree he described the layout of the farm and farmhouse.

He also told several stories that he remembers from his childhood. His family moved to Tennessee when he was young. We had a very enjoyable visit. Later the next week as I thought about our visit, I started putting together all he had told me. I called Paul and asked him to draw out all he had told me about the farm. I also asked him to write the stories he had related to me. Paul did a great job of drawing the farm and layout of the house. Here are the stories as related by Paul Bass Jr.

"On Christmas Day all of the men would rabbit hunt. I remember one occasion Ray (my grandfather), Jerome's brother, ask Paul Bass Sr. if he could see a rabbit sitting on a nest in some brush. Ray eventually shot the rabbit. Some of the rabbits were roasted in front of the

fireplace on a string turning around hanging from nails under the mantle. Ray had a full choke shotgun that he shot a bird out of a fruit tree some 75 yards from the back porch. No one else could top that for distant shooting. While roasting the rabbits we would role hot coals out on the hearth and cook thin slices of cured ham. Dora always made biscuits about 5 inches in diameter. One biscuit with some rabbit or ham made a meal. One Christmas Day I received a football and a piece of fruit from Santa. About the 1st or 2nd time we kicked the football it was punctured on a cut corn stalk end standing in the corn field at the end of the chicken house. Early memories from the 1930s by A. Paul Bass Jr. May 20, 2001.

From the cemetery on Parker Road, Paul showed me where when he was 8 or 9 years old, Marvin or Dewey hooked up the mule and plow and let him try his hand at plowing the corn field, after plowing up a couple or rows, they decided it wasn't a good idea.

Meeting with Lillie Burleson

On Sunday, August 4th, 1996 I went to talk with LILLIE BURLESON. She lives on Rutherford Road in Albemarle, NC. Carroll and Betty, who live across the street, and John H. Burleson went with me.

We talked about our different Burleson lines. Lillie is 87 years old and is very alert and she could remember dates and peoples names with such ease. She was very encouraging to me and she was very proud of her family.

She gave me four (4) pictures. Two (2) of the Old Burleson School, one taken around 1890 and one taken 1917/1918 that she was in. Lillie was able to tell me everyone that was in the picture. One picture was the Old Pine Grove School that her husband (Simeon Burleson) was in. She also gave me a picture of my great-great Grandfather William (Billie) Burleson. She talked about him as if she personally knew him, but he died about 10 years before she was born. All of her knowledge came from family members talking about Grandpa Billie, especially JAPATHY (JAP). She said that Jap loved to tell stories of Grandpa Billie and his father Isaac Jr. I asked her about Isaac Sr. She said that one day Isaac Sr. saw that his daughters were getting all dressed up and that meant that their boyfriends were coming. He got mad (he was a big man) and picked up the milk churn over his head and dropped it. This messed them all up and his wife got so mad she threw a butcher knife at him as he ran out the door. The knife stuck in the door jam. She said later they all laughed about it every time they saw the hole in the door jam.

I asked about Isaac Jr.'s grave. She said the land where he was buried changed hands and the place had grown up. The new owner, not realizing what he was doing, cleared the field and erased all evidence of the graves. John H. Burleson knows where the field is and he is going to show me later.

We went into great detail about my great grandfather EBIN. I had received a copy of a picture of Ebin from Velsa West. She said her mother had prized it very much. According to family members this was the only picture ever taken. I asked Lillie if she could remember when this picture was taken. She said that it was Ebin, but she remembered him with a long full beard. She said that Ebin didn't fare well in the Civil War. He was taken prisoner of war and held for several months, and when he returned home, he was starved half to death and was blind. It took him several years to recover.

There is a Burleson Cemetery on Parker Road. She told me how it became a cemetery. When Billie's youngest son William, by his first wife Sarah Harwood was 21 he became sick (cancer) and all of his brothers and sisters would take turns taking care of him.

Everyday he would want to be taken out to a big Oak tree and he would sit there in a straight back wooden chair. He loved that spot so much that he said he wanted to be buried there. So he was the first grave and now there are 35 or 40 graves in the cemetery.

She also showed me where Ebin's farm was. There was a big Oak Tree that he spent his last years sitting under. She said Jap always loved to sit and talk to Ebin under that tree.

On August 13, (Tuesday) I went back to see Lillie, she helped me with her line so I could enter it on my computer. She also gave me some more pictures and a book (History of Canton Church). She showed me where the First Burleson School was located at 24921 Fink Road. The 2nd Burleson School was located at 28238 Parker Rd. Billie's farm was located at 28139 Parker Road. Ebin's farm was at 26804 Burleson Road.

We had our first meeting in the Stanly County Library. There were eight present; J.D.& Karol, P.K & Hazel, Tony, Alvin, John H., Burleson and Aaron Lorch. We had a good time discussing our family trees.

Students At Old Burleson School


This is a newspaper article Lillie gave me. While we were talking she listed everyone in the picture by name. She was able to tell a little story about most of them, who they married and a little about what happened to them later in life. I wish I had been able to record the discussion, but I was able to record all the names and they are listed on the next page.

This picture fascinated me because several of the children in the picture were younger brothers and sisters of my grandfather, Ray Burleson. I had heard their names but that was all I knew about them. In 1918 my grandfather was in Europe in World War I. His brother, Dewey Burleson, is on the back row listed as #8. He married Mattie Rowland and they had two children; Alvin, who died at birth in1928, and Mildred, who was born in1930, and currently lives in Albemarle. Ray's sister, Jerome Burleson, is #25, and she is married to Paul Bass Sr. Paul worked on projects that build dams around the country. They moved to Tennessee. They have 2 children; Paul Jr. and Ruby, who both still live in Tennessee.



If any of the children in this picture are your relatives, would you please send in any information you have about them. We will publish it in a future issue. Notice the hair bow on the girl #21. Everyone who has seen the picture has been interested in the huge bow.

This picture, believed to have been taken in 1918, shows the student body of the old Burleson School. It was located about five miles west of Albemarle, not very far from the Canton Church community of today. Lillie showed me the location where the school stood, and it is at 28238 Parker Road. This school was abandoned when consolidation took place and the pupils formerly attending Burleson School went to Endy and Millingport. Mrs. Sim Burleson, who appears in the picture, brought it to the newspaper, with identification.

Burlison, Burleyson, or Burleson, What Do You Think?

By John Hoyle Burleson

The father of our Stanly County Isaac is believed to be John the son of Aaron I. Both are listed among tithes of Lunenburg County Virginia. *Sunlight on the Southside, Lists of Tithes of Lunenburg County Virginia.* In 1749 John Burlison is in Talbots District. Aaron Burleson is listed in the Phelps District in 1748.

John appears next in the newly created Bedford County Virginia court record of 1754-1761. John Burlison and his brother Jonathan Burlison were summoned to answer to charges of riot. They did not appear. This is the last early record of Burleson in Virginia. It is believed they all left for North Carolina, South Carolina and Georgia.

There is strong evidence that Aaron took up land on the Savannah River prior to 1757. This Aaron is believed to be the same Aaron (Aaron I) from Lunenburg Virginia. On his crown grant his name was listed as Aaron Bereston however, on plats of property adjoining this land, the owner is listed as Aaron Burleson.

John Burlison's travels are lost to us. According to family tradition he was killed during the American Revolution. John's two sons David and Our Isaac both saw service from this area, Mecklenburg and Salisbury Districts, North Carolina. David's name was spelled Burlison on most records and on his will and tombstone.

By the time of the American Revolution in North Carolina our Patriarch Isaac was enlisted in Captain Charles Polk's Company as Isaac Burlison. This record was in 1776. Captain Polk submitted his list of troops (where Isaac Burlison appears three times) to receive payment for service from the United States.

In John Melchor's collection of papers is a ledger of his store that was located in the present Mount Pleasant area of Cabarrus County. Melchor was born in Chester Pennsylvania and opened a gristmill and a general store. His daughter Sarah became the wife of Achilles Almond of Stanly County.

Melchor made an entry in 1793 of Isack Boloson. This note was secured by Major Smith and Joseph Cooper. In 1819 there were entries for William Burlesson and David Burleson. Melchor spelled these names as they sounded to him.

Isaac's name appears on a petition to allow Melchor to build a mill dam across Rocky River in Cabarrus County. Here the name was spelled Burlinson. This document was drawn up and sent to our state legislature in December 1800. Approximately 75 other Stanly County residents signed the petition. Some were Jacob Moose, Elyja Hunnicut, Frederich Rogers, Sherod Roland, William Lowder, Howel Harwood, Nehemiah Hearn, Absalom Harwood, Edward Almond, Solomon Burris, William Smith and Jacob Cooper.

The spelling of Burleson in the Stanly County Census varied from year to year. In the 1800 census Isaac Sr. and his brother David lived in Almond Township and were recorded by the same person, but we find David and his son's family spelled Burleyson Isaac Sr.'s name was spelled Burlison.

In 1810 Isaac Sr. and Isaac Jr.'s names appear as Burlison. The 1820 census was lost and in 1830 we find only three sons of Isaac Sr. in Stanly County. Their names are Isaac Jr. Burlson, David Burlyson and Joseph Burleyson. In 1840 only Joseph Burleyson is listed in Stanly County.

By the 1850 census Joseph Burleyson is gone but three of his sons are listed as Benjamin Burleson, Dirrick Burdson, and Wesley Burrelsen. The different spellings can be attributed to several factors. First, all three were orphaned before any formal schooling and only Benjamin was raised by family, Susan Ritchie, who was an aunt. The others were placed in families not associated to the Burleson family to my knowledge. Isaac Jr. is still listed with his four sons in Almond Township. They are all spelled Burleson.

The 1860 census is of no help because of the obvious errors, such as different spelling for siblings living in the same household. Most families in the 1870 census spelled the name Burlison with only Joseph, William, William Jr. and Ebin spelling theirs Burleyson. All in the 1880 census spelled the name Burleyson. The census only tells us that by 1880 the "i" was replaced with an "e" or "ey".

The new century brought new school. By 1925 the community schools were gone and qualifications for teachers became more standardized. They taught and encouraged their students to drop the "y" in the spelling of their name (Burleyson to Burleson).

Another factor would be Stanly County starting to keep more official records such as birth certificates and death certificates. The clerks were becoming more professional and like the teachers recorded names as they heard them, not how they were hand written in the family bible.

Today we still see Burleyson, but most are spelled Burleson. It really doesn't matter, as we are all cousins. Maybe in a later issue we will trace the spelling back to England where we find a William Burleston. This name appeared on documents dated 6 June 1391.

There are a lot of different stories and family traditions that have been handed down, but I have found that the Burleson Family Association only publishes what has been proven as fact. The Burleson Family: Early History in America

Reunion Speech of Helen Burleson Kelso, Editor; June, 1991

We tend to feel a great deal of pride when we read or hear of a distinguished ancestor, and feel that their success in the past gives us a touch of glory, too. On the other hand, we feel no shame, but manage to distance ourselves quite effectively when we learn of an ancestor who has not brought honor to the family name. Neither of these attitudes is quite logical, since we certainly have had no control whatever over either the successful ancestor or the one who may have been less so. There is some Biblical mention of this, however, when we read in Exodus XXXIV.7: ... visiting the iniquity of the fathers upon the children, and upon the children's children, unto the third and fourth generations. But enough of that.

What we can learn from both the good and the bad is a hint of our own strengths and weaknesses, some of which could very well be genetic in origin. When we recognize certain of these traits in ourselves, then it is possible for us to have some control.

Our earliest proved Burleson in America, Edward Burleson, seems to have had quite a temper, and was quite willing to defy authority. This character trait revealed itself in the Spring of 1685 when he was called to the Court at Springfield in the Massachusetts Bay Colony for "being a disturber & molester of the peace at a town meeting, abetting others and himself voting contrary to law & professing he would do it, although it cost him five pounds, for which disturbing and abusive carriages tending to the breaking of all good order & disturbing the peace, for which his Court Judge meet, he pay as a fine to the Courts five pounds and Courts charges". The ruckus, in which our Edward seems to have been a ringleader, was no doubt due to the fact that many of the settlers in Suffield objected to their minister, Rev. John Younglove. Edward's friend, neighbor and possibly his relative, David Winchel, was also highly critical of Mr. Younglove, and on the same day David also appeared in court and was fined four pounds and charges. Edward and David and others were very upset by Rev. Younglove's sermons.

Again, in March of 1691, David & Jonathan Winchel, and Edward Burlison, all of Suffield, were called to court to answer charges of "reproachful and scurrilous vile speeches against Mr. George Philips their late minister". No doubt, Edward Burleson was serious about his religion, as were all Puritans. In fact, it was not until 1710, with the arrival of Rev. Ebenezer Devotion, that Suffield's Congregational Church had a minister who pleased its members, and he served the church in Suffield for 31 years.

Documents which we have already published tell us that Edward was a planter and also a flax dresser, a somewhat incendiary occupation, as we have learned from one deed which we have published. The discovery of Edward's occupation gives us a bit of a clue as to his origin, if he was indeed the original immigrant, since one would reasonably expect a flax dresser's country of origin to be one where flax is grown.

We know that Edward Burlison was an inhabitant of Suffield when he took the oath of allegiance to the King of England January 31, 1678. Edward was married to Sarah _____. Her maiden name and the date and place of their marriage has not been proved. A secondary source states that he was in the area in 1664, but we have not yet found the actual record.

Edward and Sarah's children were born in Suffield. The oldest was John, born 9 Oct 1677, a cooper, who married Sarah Holliday (sometimes spelled Halliday) 16 Nov 1698. Sarah's father Walter Holliday was also a cooper.

John and Sarah's children, all born Suffield, were:

Sarah born 20 Nov 1699; John born 28 Dec 1701 who married Mehepzibah Bromley 29 Feb 1728;

Jonathan born 11 Jun 1704;

Mercy born 12 Jan 1706 but not baptized until 15 Mar 1713; Joseph born 26 Nov 1708;

Abigail born 11 Nov 1710 (baptized 3 Jul 1715);

Mary born 6 Feb 1713 married her cousin Daniel Burlison 20 Sep 1744; Elizabeth born 28 Mar 1715 married James Davis 2 Feb 1740; Rachel born 29 Nov 1716 married John Warner, Jr., 14 Apr 1741.

Edward and Sarah's second child was Fearnot, born 18 Dec 1679, a carpenter, who married Elizabeth Buckland 8 Feb 1705. Fearnot and Elizabeth's children were:

Esther, born 15 Feb 1706 at Windsor, Hartford Co., CT, married John Matson/Matteson 30 Jul 1723 at Simsbury;

Elizabeth, born 2 Jul 1709 at Windsor;

Ebenezer, born 8 May 1711 at Windsor, married Sarah Brace 19 May 1736 at Windsor;

Job, born 7 Aug 1714 at Suffield, married Thankful Gaines 3 May 1744 at Hartford;

Daniel, born 7 Mar 1717 at Suffield, married Mary Burleson 20 Sep 1744 at Cromwell, Middlesex Co., CT;

Mary, born 3 Mar 1720 at Hartford.

Edward and Sarah's third child was Return, born 5 Apr 1682, who died, 4 Oct 1709, having been lost at sea.

Edward and Sarah's fourth child was their daughter Mary who was born 22 Jun 1683. She married Isaac Cornwall 29 Jul 1714.

The youngest child was Edward, born 1 Mar 1686, a cripple, who learned the tailor's trade at Hadley, Massachusetts. He also taught school in a remote part of the village of Suffield. No record of marriage has been found for Edward, but we have found evidence of his love for Elizabeth Jesse, whom he was forbidden to marry. Apparently, being unable to marry his one true love, he never married.

As we all know, the first Edward of Suffield died there in 1698, leaving a modest estate which included "old Bibles and other books". In all the many documents left which pertain to this first known and proved Burleson in America, there is nothing to suggest that he was anything more than a farmer and a flax-dresser. On the other hand, when I make this statement, I do acknowledge that we will, no doubt, learn more about him and his family in the future.

We do not have time to detail all of Edward's hundreds of known descendants, many of whom have brought a great deal of honor to the name of Burleson. However,

since that strange "Sir Edward" story (Sir Edward supposedly arrived in 1716 at Preston, Connecticut or Jewett City, Connecticut, depending upon the story-teller) keeps popping up, I did try to find its source, and I think I may have succeeded.

Edward's son John, born in Suffield in 1677, had a son John born 1701, also in Suffield. This John did go to Preston, Connecticut; he married there in 1728 and then moved back to Suffield, then back to Preston, then on to Rhode Island in 1742, where he died in 1759 leaving a will naming his children. John's son Edward Burleson was born 1737 in Suffield, and it is through his descendants that this "Sir Edward" story seems to have been a family tradition. This latter Edward had a son Edward who was the father of Allen Briggs Burleson (b. 29 Nov 1816 RI d. 29 Dec 1887 Jewett City, CT m. Mary Lathrop Fanning 23 May 1853 at Jewett City, Ct). Edward and Mary had a son Edward F. Burleson who was the source for the "Sir Edward" story which was repeated in a New London County, CT biographical publication in 1905. Edward and Edward F. both seem to have been in contact with Dr. Rufus C. Burleson back when Rufus was working so diligently on Burleson family history, and the story was repeated by him, and copied by many others.

One would expect that if our first Edward Burleson in America had been knighted either before or after his arrival in the colonies, that such an honor would be reflected in the documents which pertain to him. This is not the case. It is possible that some earlier Burleson exhibited valor in some war, which attracted the attention of the crown, but that, too, is yet to be discovered. But Sir Edward or not, his 1716 arrival date is completely wrong. And we have proved it wrong again and again. With the validity of that date for the arrival of the first Edward in America proved false, we have, at the same time, destroyed the much-quoted 1726 arrival date for Aaron.

There was one custom in the early congregational church which does present a possibility for our "Sir Edward", and that was the tradition of addressing church ministers as "Sir" rather than "Rev." or "Father". It is possible that Edward served informally as a preacher on the numerous occasions that Suffield was without a minister in those early days. If so, he could have been called "Sir Edward", affectionately rather than officially. We also know that Edward's son Fearnot, when he died in 1732 in Suffield, left, among many other items, a large number of religious books, bibles, an ordination sermon, and also a tuning fork, which suggests more than a passing interest in church work. Whose ordination sermon was it that Fearnot kept? Another mystery.

As most of us know, Jo and John Burles (a customary abbreviation for Burleson and usually spelled Burles: the colon indicating the "son" suffix) arrived in New England in 1635, John aboard the "Blessing" and Jo. aboard the "Defence". Without further information, they can not be linked to our early Edward of Suffield. We also know that Edw. Burriston (may or may not be Burleson) arrived in Virginia in 1663, followed by Jno. Barthelson in 1674, An. Burlinton and Ann Burlison in 1681. Again, without further evidence, we can not assume that they fit into our family tree, although it is possible, of course. It is good to remember that many people who arrived in the colonies returned to England, either temporarily or permanently, and that the documentation for many of the Virginia arrivals was falsified in order for the "importer" to get more land. Sort of like a Duval County, Texas, Box 13.

The first documented Burleson in the South was Aaron, who received a crown grant 15 Dec 1749 in Lunenburg County, Virginia, in an area which became part of

Bedford County just a few years later. His land was on both sides of the Little Otter River. Aaron also appears on a 1748 tithe list in Lunenburg County, with 1 tithe. Jonathan Burleson appears on the same list, with 1 tithe. By 1749 John Burlinson shows up. Then in 1752, Jonathan appears as head, with John listed in his household, for a total of 2 tithes. Aaron does not appear in 1752 and whether his absence is due to incomplete lists, or to his moving away, we can not say.

In Bedford County, Virginia, order book 1A and 1B, 1754-1761, we find Jonathan and John Burleson in trouble with the authorities for refusing to assist a Constable in the execution of his office. And again, for causing a riot.

Apparently, they objected to the actions of the Constable and were very vocal about it. The trait of opposing authority, vehemently, in the face of a perceived injustice or wrong is once more recorded in the courts.

Later, in Howard County, Missouri, 28 May, 1822 the State of Missouri indicted Edward Burleson (son of James, son of Aaron "II") for inciting a riot. The reason for said riot was not stated, but whatever the cause, we suspect some Burleson temperament was involved. Still later, in Hardeman County, Tennessee, 1828 and 1829, the same Edward, his brother Joseph and their father, James Burleson, defended themselves in court following an indictment for a riot. They did have to pay a fine. One does wonder what caused them such excitement that would lead them to riot. All three moved to Texas, where they made outstanding contributions to that state's history, and none were known for unreasonable behavior.

Family tradition has given us certain names of the 7 sons and 5 daughters of Aaron "I". We have no proof, one way or the other, although, curiously, the surnames of his traditional married daughters are nearly the same as the surnames of the married daughters of Daniel & Elizabeth Burleson Shipman, named in his will dated 8 Nov 1798, Warren Co., KY. Daniel Shipman's will named his daughters: Sarah Harrington, Anna Lee, Lucy Gage, Phoebe Crawford, Rebecca Cisco, and Mary Johnson. Of course, proof of Elizabeth Burleson's marriage to Daniel Shipman has not been found, either, although family tradition is strong in this regard, reinforced by other clues.

Jonathan Burleson and his son (?) John clearly were both of age by 1749 Virginia, and one would expect both of them to have had families. As a matter of fact, it is not outside the realm of possibility for Jonathan to have been the father of Aaron "II" AND John as well. We note that John and Sarah Holliday Burleson of Suffield had a son Jonathan born in Suffield 11 June 1704. So far, we have found no further information on him, unless he is the Jonathan Burleson found in 1749-1761 Virginia.

By 11 September, 1757 Aaron Burleson is recorded on the Savannah River, in St. Paul Parish, Georgia, and he received a crown grant there 1 May 1759. It is likely that the 1749 Virginia crown grant and the 1759 Georgia crown grant were to the same Aaron Burleson for whom an administration was recorded in Wilkes County, Georgia December, 1783. Family tradition has said that Aaron Burleson "I" died in NC in 1763, but there appears to be no evidence to support this tradition.

Aaron Burleson is found, October of 1761, on Richland Creek in Cumberland County, North Carolina, and also on Dunham's Creek. James Burleson was in Anson County, North Carolina in October, 1779, when he signed a petition. Numerous Burlesons, including Aaron, appear in other early North Carolina records, but with little

in the way of clues as to their parentage. We do thank heaven for those Burlesons who left wills or deeds naming their children. Otherwise, proving our lines would be hopeless.

Burlesons, including Edward of Suffield, have fought and defended their families against hostile Indian tribes throughout our early history. Burlesons have participated bravely in all of the wars of colonial America, as well as the American Revolution, the War of 1812, and all wars up to and including the most recent "Operation Desert Storm". Records from these wars have been of great help with many of our Northern and Southern families.

Without a great deal of difficulty, almost all the Northern Burleson lines can be traced back to Edward of Suffield, while our Southern lines can be <u>proved</u> only to:

Aaron of Georgia (was he Aaron "I"?);

Aaron "II" (son of Jonathan? or John? or of Aaron "I" by a first wife?); Served in the Rev. War from NC. Left will probated in

Washington Co., NC (now TN) 27 May, 1782, naming his 13 children and his wife (not named - but proved

by later deeds to be Rachel). Their children were John,

Jonathan, Joseph, Elizabeth, Thomas, Sarah, Aaron, Rachel,

Nancy, Abigail, Mary, Rhoda, and James.

Nancy, Abigail, Mary, Rhoda, and Jami

David (son of John? or Jonathan?); Served in the Rev. War from NC.

Left will dated February, 1828 in Rutherford Co., TN naming his wife Ursula and their sons John, Moses, David, William, Hill K., and Isaac and daughters Sarah Rolling, Mary Brooks, Nelly

Rolling, Margaret Pope, and Ursula Self.

Isaac of Stanly Co., NC (son of ?); Served in the Rev. War from NC.

Isaac of Buncombe Co., NC and moved to Monroe Co., TN (son of ?).

Was he the Isaac who served in the Rev. War from SC?

It is thought that he is the father (by a first wife) of

Edward Burleson of Buncombe Co., NC. Isaac left a will in Monroe Co., TN naming his wife Polly and their children Isaac M. H., Octavy D., Charlotte, William, John R. D., and Vanburin.

Jesse (probable son of Aaron of Georgia by a first wife).

Served in the Rev. War from NC - was in Valley Forge encampment.

Left a Family Bible giving birth dates of all his children whose names were Aaron, Sarah, Elizabeth, Daniel, Salathael, Isaac, William, and Jane.

Time does not permit going into detailed genealogy or a detailed history of any of the families mentioned, in spite of the fact that some of the history is very interesting. These families have made very significant contributions to progress in every part of America, and we owe each of them our gratitude for their many sacrifices in helping to make America the best place to live on earth.

I have given merely the highlights of what we know of the earliest Burleson families in America. Although we have published much important information, we still have a great deal of work to do in all the old records not yet studied, and there are plenty of those waiting for volunteers.

In the early days most of our ancestors were farmers, who were then arid still are the backbone of America. Many also learned trades, such as our Suffield Burleson coopers, carpenters, tailors. All were called to military duty when the need arose. The women cooked, and spun, and sewed, and many learned to play a musical instrument. On the frontier they were also expected to know how to use a gun, because when the men were away, the women defended the home. One common thread found among the early Burlesons both north and south was a religious zeal, and we have found among our Burlesons many church leaders of various protestant faiths. Also, a love of music. Any one of the names mentioned today could be tile subject of a fascinating book. So get busy, you Burlesons, and start writing!

Our Links to the Texas Burlesons

During the past couple of monthly meetings of the Burleson Family Research Group, I have made available information on Edward Burleson and William Weatherford. Both men were prominent in American history. In the early 1800's one followed the path of his Indian heritage inherited from his Mother and became a chief of the Creek Indian Nation and dedicated his life to their cause. The other one was the product of the forever-westward movement of the pioneers of the Southern States. Both had roots here in the Southern Piedmont area of North Carolina. The Burlesons and Weatherfords were documented here in old Anson County, NC as well as Lunenburg County, VA.

Recently my wife Nancy, after months of trying,

found a copy of the book <u>Edward Burleson, Texas Frontier Leader</u> through a website on the internet and gave it to me as a gift. I have found the book most informative and I wish to share the treasury of information it contained. This book about Edward Burleson was written by John H. Jenkins and Kenneth Kesselus and was published in 1990.

To anyone not familiar with Edward Burleson and William Weatherford, let me give you this short history. David Burleson (a brother to our Isaac) married Ursula Weatherford daughter of Wilkinson Weatherford. Wilkinson would have been a second cousin to William Weatherford who was known as Chief Red Eagle of the Creek Indian Nation.

By 1800 David and Isaac along with several of the Weatherfords had made the move 15 miles north from Richardson Creek in old Anson County into Montgomery County (the part that later become Stanly County). Within a few years all would move westward except our Isaac and his family.

Another Burleson family that was living on Richardson Creek as early as 1761 was that of Aaron II. He began his westward migration by moving to Tryon County, North Carolina and later to Buncombe County, North Carolina. He is listed in Washington County, North Carolina that later became part of eastern Tennesee. This is where Aaron II was killed by Indians and left 14 children to survive on the extreme western frontier. The sons of Aaron II would play a major role in extending the territory of our young nation.

Two of these sons, James and Jonathan, were appointed commissaries and served on the staff of General Andrew Jackson in his campaign against the Creek Nation. Jackson's Army was successful in defeating and killing most of the Creek warriors. After the defeat of the Creek Indians Alabama and Mississippi were open for white Settlers.


The surrender of the Creek Indians came at Fort Toulouse in 1813 when Chief Red Eagle (William Weatherford) rode in to General Jackson's Camp and surrendered. Many of Jackson's staff wanted to hang Chief Red Eagle on the spot. We do not know what action James and Jonathan recommended, but General Jackson spared Red Eagle's life.

Stephen Austin Colony was the first in the new territory of Texas and here we find James, his son Edward and several other Burleson families. Here we also find the Shipman, Gage, and Kuykendall families that were among the first to settle. All four of these families are linked by marriage and appear to migrate together from Virginia and North Carolina to the West.

Rufus Burleson, the son of Jonathan, would become the founder of Baylor University. Edward Burleson, the son of James, was the first military leader of Texas. It was Edward that was first to give the call to arms for protection against Indians and Mexican Armies. He held the highest military ranks and was victorious in thirty battles never retreating. He was a statesman in the formation of the Texas Nation and the State of Texas. He served as the Vice President of the Lone Star Republic.

Recording the history of Texas cannot be done without telling of the life and deeds of Edward Burleson and his family, but rest at ease because Edward's deeds have been recorded and the map reflects his accomplishments. The Southern boundary of the United States is the Rio Grande River...not the Red River!

This is the ancestral chart for John Hoyle Burleson's family. Absalom and Sarah Ann Sides Burleson, John's great-grandparents was the subject of our first book. Absalom was a Civil War Veteran and John is responsible for all the great history of this family being recorded.



Our regular monthly meeting was Monday night, July 7, 2003 at Lena's Farm House. We had a great time with about 25 present. Several people brought interesting items to share with the group. Calvin Burleson, grandson of Ebin Burleson, brought a medal that Ebin received for attending a reunion of Confederate Veterans. Ebin was very active and enjoyed attending these reunions and meetings. In a conversation with Mae Burleson Moore, Ebin's daughter she said that she could remember Ebin getting the whole family together in a wagon pulled by a horse and traveling to Salisbury to attend one of these reunions. She was young when Ebin died, but that was one of the things she said he really enjoyed. Here is a picture of the Medal. We are going to research further to find out more about this Medal.

Grandpa Billie's Bible

My first impression of viewing the Bible that belonged to William Burleyson was that the information inside could answer many questions. This proved to be the case only in a few entries. I had hoped to find a chronological order of the birth and death dates of Billie's first and second family or others, but what I found was quite different.

For the physical characteristics, the Bible is about 5 inches wide by 8 inches tall and was published in 1847. Today it is in remarkably good condition. There is little wear or tear for a new Bible, much less one that is 155 years old. This fact alone is enough for me to believe that it belonged to Grandpa Billie.

The entries in the Bible appear to be made by several different persons. Three I can identify by their statements in the Bible.

I believe Billie himself made the first entry. It is in very nice, impressive handwriting using ink that has smeared and turned brown over the veers. This entry is on the front inside cover page. He records the birth and death dates of Isaac and Katherine Burleyson and continues to say, "Rote by their son Wm. Burleyson."

On a page at the beginning of the Gospel of Matthew, in the same nice handwriting, Billie records his birth date. Directly above this is the same listing, only it is "rote by Jap". The quality of this handwriting is considerably less. Japethy had custody of this Bible so his entries could have been made up until 1953. I find no entry dated after 1893.

There are two entries I believe that Reubin wrote. One is when he wrote down how old he was by the number of years, 19, and how many months, 2. He finished by saying this is the 20" day of February 1884. The practice of numbering the years, months, and days for a person's age was common of the period to be cut

onto the tombstone. Reubin was doing this in a Bible three years before he died. From the math problems that are made randomly on these and other pages, I believe Reubin was making this entry as no one had kept up the book since Billie's original entry. Reubin's other signed entry is a quote or verse from somewhere. It starts, "If any man should add to this..." and is signed Reubin Burleyson, Seribling 1884.

By these two entries I can only guess that Reubin was possibly sick and was afraid of not being remembered so he made the entries

for his own immortality. He would surely die on 21[°] of November 1887.

All the other entries could be by these persons or anyone else. They contain birth dates of all of Billie and Rodv's family, but not in order and along with some other information.

The new information for me is the death dates of Katherine and Reubin. Also the confirmation of Billie being the son of Isaac and Katherine exists no place else that I know of The selected verses, numbered by hand, (approximately 1 through 25), mostly Psalms, is the only sign that any text page had ever been used.

Elizabeth Almond's death date is listed beside Billie's sister Dovey Harwood's death date. The mystery continues for me to identify who Elizabeth is. Could she be a sister to Billie or just someone that died the same year as Billie's sister Dovey in 1893? I would suppose she is family, but how close? Could she be the mother of Sara Anne Sides, wife of Absalom? We'll just have to keep digging!

The Bible belonged to Jap Burleson and when he died in 1953, at the home of Lillie Burleson, she became the owner. Lillie, knowing how important this Bible would be to other Burleson researchers, donated it to the Stanly County Library. The Bible can be viewed at the Stanly County Library.

This is listed in a Heritage Book in the library in Ripley, Mississippi. AARON BURLESON, 1st, The fifth Great Grandfather of the Author

It was in Wales, a rugged little province of the British Isles, that Aaron was born in 1703. Of his birthplace and early life before he immigrated to America we know nothing. Aaron immigrated to America in 1724, settling in Baltimore, Md., and moving on to Lunenburg Co., Va., in 1726. He died in Rutherford Co., N. C. in 1763. The descendants of Aaron are scattered throughout the nation and participate today in almost every branch of human activity.

Aaron married a maiden named Sarah, and to this union eight sons and six daughters were born.

A11 of the sons served in the Revolutionary War, and only three survive:

John, son of Aaron, Ist, was born in 1730 in Baltimore Md. He went to N, C. in about 1760, and was killed in the Revolutionary War-date is unknown. His wife's name is unknown, but we are told that John had two- sons, named David and Isaac. No information is available on Isaac at this time.

David Burleson, son of 1730 John Burleson, was born in 1752; Lunenburg Co., Va., and died Aug..13, 1832. David married Ursula Weatherford a Creek Indian maiden. She was the daughter of Wilkerson Weatherford, who was the son of William Weatherford. David and Ursula are buried in the Burleson Cemetery, on the Burleson farm near Murfreesboro, in Rutherford Co., TN. On the old Burleson home place near the site of the original log cabin stands a government marker. It was placed there by Captain William Lytle, Chapter of the D,A.R.'s and bears the following inscription:

David Burleson, James Farris Battalion, Col. Wades Reg. North Carolina. Discharged Oct. 9, 1782-Died Aug. 13, 1832

Where Did I Come From?

By: John Hoyle Burleson

Have you ever wondered who you are? Has a friend or family member ever told you that you look like your father or mother or that you have the same mannerisms as a grandparent? I have. I see some of this in my two granddaughters. They don't look like me thank goodness, but the four year old is a little hardheaded.

In my defense I can only take a fraction of credit for my grandchildren's genes. Let's do the math. Every one of us has two parents, we all have four grandparents, we all have eight great grandparents, we all have sixteen great-great grandparents, we all have thirty-two great-great-great grandparents and we all have sixty-four great-great-great-great grandparents. I'm stopping there because for me this takes us back to Isaac Sr., born 1750 and the patriarch of the Burleson family in Stanly County.

The total number of ancestors from me back to Isaac Sr.'s generation is 126. I have not discovered all their names at this time but I'm still working on it. To go back any further I would need access to J.D. Burleson's database of the Burleson Family. His list is simply amazing. I just explained that with each generation you go back your ancestors double, J. D's did also until he recorded umpteen generations back through Celtic England, back to Northern Europe.

Somewhere in Northern Europe the generations quit doubling and started to divide in half. J.D. has recorded and followed this division all the way back to the single digits of Noah Burleson and his wife from Mount Ararat. Noah Burleson was a ship builder and owner of a large zoo. (Reference to Genesis 10 verse 5.)

Now back to my humble research of my Stanly County ancestors. I know that the Burleson family came from England so I consider myself of English decent. My project was to go back to my four grandparents and make a pedigree chart for each of them. Following is the results.

I'll start with my Father's side. My grandfather, John F. Burleson, was English and his wife Ada Efird was German. Next I went to my Mother's Hatley family with her father, James Hoyle Hatley who was English and his wife Vernie Herlocker who was German. Looks like a tie so far. The pedigree sheet back shows the Burleson line, which is strong English, with names like Burleson, Harwood, Clay, Castle, and Almond. There are also Sides families who are German.

The Efird line is strong German with names of Efird, Harkey, Coble, and Cagle, however there are also several Harwoods that are English.

My Hurlocker line is strong German with Hurlocker, Rhinehart, Melchoir, Sides, and Eudy, but with several Lowders that are English.

My Hatley line should be strong English, but there are more German ancestors than English. England is representative only in the Hatley and Rogers lines. German family names are Sides, Moose, Lyerly and Bushart.

My counts of identified ancestors are 46 German and 25 English. These facts are a reflection of the Burleson Families that settled on Little Bear Creek in Stanly County. The later generation had connection with the people of Western and Northern Stanly County. Primarily German immigrants settled this area.

With my newly found German genes I began to research the history of German immigration into North Carolina to see if they "pulled their weight" like my Burleson ancestors did in fighting for and settling our country that we have today or were they "late" immigrants that just fell in line and reaped the benefits of those who settled before them. Again I was pleasantly surprised. In the future I will not call German family immigrants, but will refer to the time they arrived in America to settle the new land as I do my English ancestors.

My Burleson line arrived in America in 1726 according to tradition. We now know that there were Burleson in New England as early as 1655. But Aaron's arrival from England and settling in Virginia is the start of my Burleson line.

The Clays can be traced back to John Clay who arrived in Virginia in 1613. Our Harwood line goes back to William Harwood of Thurlby County, Lincoln, England. William's son, Sir Edward Harwood was a member of the Virginia Company of London, Governor of North Carolina in 1625 and Incorporator of the Providence Islands or Bahama Company in 1630.

William's son George who is the ancestor of my Harwood line arrived in Jamestown on board the ship <u>Abigail</u> in 1622. He came to take over 'Martin's Hundred' that was wiped out in an Indian uprising and he resettled this charter of one hundred families.

The Castle or Cassel family of Stanly County is not known for sure. The Castle family comes from Henry Castle who at the age of 22 came from England on board the ship <u>*Transport*</u> in 1635 to New England. But there is also evidence that the Castle/Cassel family in the South was from German descent.

The Almond family traces its origin in America to the Isles of Wright Virginia of the early 1700. They are of English origin with many Almond families still in England today.

My Rogers line can be traced through James Rogers who at the age of 20 sailed from England on board the ship <u>Increase</u> in 1635 to Plymouth Colony. He came here to rejoin his father, Thomas Rogers, who had arrived in America aboard the <u>Mayflower</u> in 1620.

The Hatley family of England traces its name back to 300 AD to a Saxon settlement in the southwest corner of Cambridgeshire. I would like to quote my friend Coy Hatley in his history, "The Doomsday Book completed in 1016 shows two spellings of the village name; both of which have similar pronunciation: Hatelai and Atelai. The present spelling "Hatley" probably came about in the fourteenth century, and was certainly established by the fifteenth century."

My German forefathers history is just as impressive. They were certainly not latecomers, but were on the front edge of the frontier just like my English ancestors.

The Stanly County Moose family traces its history to Gall Davidt Mussgnug from Sollingen/Baden Wurttenburg, Germany. JoHann Davidt and his wife Elizabetha came over in 1751 to Pennsylvania then to North Carolina.

My Efird family arrived in America in 1773 on the ship *Britannia*. Their roots came from Wurttenburg, Germany.

The Coble Family arrived in America in 1733 on board the ship <u>Hope</u>. JoHann George Coble married Maria Geisler and had 12 children. Some of them moved to North Carolina.

The Cagle Family arrived in Pennsylvania on the ship <u>*The Loyal Judith*</u> in 1732 than moved by wagon train to the Moravian settlement in North Carolina. The Leon Hunt Cagle family moved to Montgomery County, North Carolina.

My Sides line goes back to Henry Sides who came to Philadelphia on the ship *Lydia* on December 11, 1739. Henry settled in Eastern Cabarrus/Western Stanly County area and raised a large family.


JoHannes Herche born 1708 came to America on the ship *Lydia* in 1743. He established the Harkey Family in North Carolina.

John Melchoir born 1750 in Pottstown, Pennsylvania settled in the Cabarrus/Stanly County area. The Hurlocker family came to Rocky River area with Melchoir. The Lipe family came from Switzerland/Germany in the 1700's.

The German families settled in communities on the North Carolina frontier where the Scotch/Irish settled on the front edge of the frontier. Our Burleson family was not Scotch/Irish but was from Northern England and settled more independent of any support group on the frontier. The ground they stood on was the ground they would defend and my ancestors did not want anyone to tell them where they could stand.

I made no judgment of how all this affects me. I now know I'm more German than English, however my two children's Mother was a Sinclair. This family is strong English. My Son-in-law, the father of my two granddaughters is from the Britt family that is also strong English. My grandchildren and future generations will have a more English make-up than mine. Let's see how they turn out!

To all Descendants of Howell Burleson you are eligible to become a member of the Son of the American Revolution SAR. Through Isaac Burleson Sr.



that Billie was Isaac Jr.'s son. Nat took it upon himself to go to Albemarle and the Register of Deeds Office and found a land deed that showed Isaac Jr selling Billie one hundred acres of land. This document proved the connection and I was accepted into the society.

I would like to encourage everyone interested in their family history to investigate the Sons of the American Revolution (SAR) or the Daughters of the American Revolution (DAR). I could not begin to list everything that this couple has done as part of the SAR and DAR. Nat was the past President of the North Carolina SAR, State Register, National Trustee, and he organized and started the Alamance Battleground Chapter SAR. Martha in the Alamance Battleground Chapter DAR, has served as the State District Director, State Board of Finance, Historian, and Treasurer.

As part of the SAR Color Guard, Nat has been involved in hundreds of Grave Marker Dedications. He was part of the color guard at the ceremony for Isaac Burleson Sr. Nat told PK that this ceremony was the largest one he had been associated with. Nat Clark, on the left, and PK Burleson on the right next to the tree. When I first started looking for my ancestors these individuals were there to help. Everyone associated with the Burleson Family Research Group



knows PK and Hazel Burleson. I published an article on PK's family on page 146 – 149 of the *Recollections*. Nat and Martha Clark are friends of PK and Hazel, but not related to the Burleson Family. I first meet Nat when PK invited me to join the Sons of the American Revolution, I submitted my application and I was missing documentation to prove

Burleson Settlements in North Carolina by John H. Burleson

Because of a recent surgery I am finding plenty of time to read. My favorite subject is History and particularly about my ancestor's participation.

The rights of the Indians that owned and occupied the land to the West supposedly hindered the Westward movement. Every settler that came down the great wagon road and took up land in the Carolina's had an abundance of land by today's standard, very few farmers could farm more that 640 acres. That is a block 1 mile by 1 mile, but the want of more and better acreage was weighed against the risk of the Indians.

The Indian's boundaries were enforced by the British and later the US Government. I'll try to use what I have learned about my Burleson family to understand why the pioneers would risk their lives and the lives of their families for land.

I am reminded of Aaron the patriarch of our Southern Burlesons. By 1745 he and his extended family John and Jonathan were living on Little Otter River in Lunenburg County, Virginia, located in the foothills of the Blue Ridge Mountains. That was the Western limits of settlement allowed by the British Government. As Aaron's family grew they moved South instead of West, down the Great Wagon Road.

In 1757 an Aaron Burleson settled West of the Savannah River (there were many Aaron's during this period) in Indian Territory on unoccupied land. This was a chip taken out of the lands owned by the Chickasaw and Creek Indians. It was not until 1758 that the Colony of Georgia established a county where Aaron was living.

We next find our Burleson's in Cumberland County (known as Moore County today), NC in 1761. The Waxhaw, Cheraw, and Kewaunee Indians had previously occupied this region. By 1761 they had been reduced in numbers and were absorbed in the Catawba Nation that sits on the North Carolina and South Carolina line on the Great Wagon Road. The Catawba Nation remained a strong force until 1800, but stopped all hostility as whites settled around their borders.

In 1763 we find an Aaron Burleson on Richardson Creek, on Rocky River. This location is in today's Union County, NC and borders the Catawba Nation east boundary. David is also here in 1779. Within a few miles west of the Nations is Turkey Creek in today's York County, SC. Land deeds show that our Burlesons had owned land here long enough to clear the land. The land and improvements were vacant by 1766. They did leave the middle fork of Turkey Creek the name of Burleson Creek.

The headwater of the Broad River to the West was in Cherokee Territory and here is when we find part of the Burleson clan in 1766. They were on Sandy Run Creek in today's Cleveland County, North Carolina. Indian raids were frequent and caused white retaliation that in 1767 Governor Tryon came from his palace on the Coast to establish a dividing line between the Cherokee and white settlers. The line he established ran from Tryon Mountain on the South Carolina line and ran straight to Fort Chiswell that protected the lead mines on the Virginia most Western frontier.

This line was in sight of the Burleson's cabin Before the Revolution the line had to be moved again because of the numbers of settlers in the foot hills. The new line would be the peaks of the Blue Ridge Mountains.

Abiding by British law our clan established their farms on Sandy Run Creek. The young children and women planted and harvested corn, the staple for man and beast. Aaron and Thomas Burleson and others hunted to provide meat for the table, but also they were exploring farther and farther for game and scouting for better lands to move to. While technically living East of the Indian boundary line they became known as "Long Hunters". They knew the best lands over the peak of the Blue Ridge very well.

By 1771 our Burlesons were among the first to cross the Blue Ridge, with their families, and settle in what would be come Tennessee. Every gain has its price and the following years several of our clan were killed and scalped in these new homes.

I have seen stories of how David the brother of our Isaac traveled from Anson in the 1780's to mid Tennessee and built a cabin only to have to leave it because of hostile Indians. He returned to Anson and then Little Bear Creek but years later (approx.1810) returned to the same cabin to live out his days with his family.

The Burlesons of the next generations would follow a common pattern. They would scout for new lands, then with their families move on to clean the trees and plant crops, always with a look out for Indians. Other settlers would follow and bring civilization and government.

Well this is a summary of what I have learned of the Burleson's and their dealing with the Indians up until 1776. I believe our Isaac and David were descendants from the Burlesons of Cumberland County and Richardson Creek. In 1776 General Griffin Rutherford of Salisbury called out the militia to crush the Cherokee Nation. Captain Thomas Shelby, Captain Ezekiel Polk, Col. Adam Alexander and Captain Charles Polk from Anson and Mecklenburg Counties in North Carolina crossed the mountain and burned seven of the chief towns of the Cherokee. Our Isaac Burleson was a member of Captain Charles Polk's Clear Creek Militia in 1776. No roster remains but it would be hard to believe that Isaac and David both just over twenty years of age did not muster for this Indian campaign. Every male form 18 to 60 was required to be in the militia.

All these events had to imprint on the next generations as they pushed the frontier to Alabama, Louisiana, Mississippi, Missouri, Indiana, and Texas. To show how this "imprinted" on the Burleson family, let me repeat a story about Hopson Burleson born 1806. He was grandson of David and Ursula Burleson, a brother to our Isaac. His chart says he was born in NC and I know David and his son David II were living on Little Bear Creek in 1806 when Hopson was born. I suppose Hopson rambled the same woods that I have rambled and went swimming at "the round hole" just as I have done many time. In my childhood I walked the same trails that Hopson walked 140 years earlier. I was looking for "pretend Indians", but Hopson's Indians were real.

Hopson's imprinted characteristics are revealed in a story in Vol. XIX, No. 1 of the Burleson Family Association Bulletin written by Eugene Pullin. I quote:

"During the years between 1825 and 1830, Hopson Burleson and several other men came to different areas (in Texas) looking for a place to settle. Fertile land, trees to build home and rail fences, grass for animals, and water in abundance made this location their choice. But Indians attacked this group, and one man was captured, tortured and killed. After the Indians left, the body was recovered and buried near the present cemetery site. These men then returned to their homes in Alabama and prepared to move their families to this new home."

Hopson must have thought these hostilities could easily be overcome by the arrival of his family or if the Indians resisted this much this land had to be the goal of his 1,000-mile search from Alabama, Indians or no Indians. Hopson's descendants are still living on this same land today.

Well there you have it. Maybe my next article will be on the Burleson clan in North Carolina and their part in the American Revolution against the hated British Troops. If you remember, by tradition, Aaron the Emigrant lost 5 of his 7 sons to this conflict. I'm sure that would have left a "British imprint" on the Burleson family.

Honoring the Grave of a Revolutionary War Soldier

May 28, 1995 by P.K. Burleson

In 1988 I was invited to become a member of the Battleground Chapter of the Sons of the American Revolution here in Burlington, However, there was the N.C. requirement that I must prove that I actually was a descendant from a **Revolutionary** War thus ancestor; began my Burleson family research.



My first endeavor was a trip to Raleigh, NC, --NC Department of Archives-- where I began an exhaustive search through Census Records, Birth Certificates, Marriage Bonds/Certificates, Wills, Deeds, and Land Sale Records.

Eventually, I was able to verify four Burleson generations beginning with Jape C. Burleson (b. Oct 26, 1884), Adam Burleson (b. Jan 29, 1847), Lee Burleson (b. 1826), and Isaac Burleson Jr. (b. 1784). During this lengthy process, I did secure the assistance of a Professional Genealogist who was able to provide additional Burleson information working toward completion at this point.

Information on the next generation back was that of Isaac Burleson, Sr. which seemed to be more difficult to establish. Fortunately in the fall of 1991, I was referred to Thurman Burleson who, supposedly, had much information on Burleson families, and who was an active member of the Burleson Family Association, Dallas, Texas; and, further, had attended several of the Annual Meetings.

Thurman and I had several telephone conversations and he confirmed the Burleson information which I had been able to assemble. When I mentioned the fact that I had been unable to find a record of Isaac Burleson being in the military, he immediately gave me information that Isaac Burleson's enlistment was in South Carolina (my search had been in NC only). Records confirmed his enlistment was with the 5th SC Regiment-Revolutionary War-April 16, 1776. Thurman and I had planned to meet in January 1992, however, his death occurred earlier.

In the meantime, my SAR application was approved and I officially became a member of the local SAR Chapter on Dec 5, 1989. Later this SAR Chapter indicated a desire to honor this Revolutionary War Patriot.

In the spring of 1995, I contacted Thurman Burleson's son, Ronnie Burleson of Richfield, NC who was able to point out the grave site of Isaac Burleson in the Ruben Springer Burial Ground, Stanly County, off of Dusty Road (NC 1226). A publication in the Stanly County Library --Private Cemeteries & Burial Grounds-- confirmed this information and stated, further, he was the first person to be buried at this location.



I then applied for a headstone through the Department of Veteran Affairs, who confirmed Isaac's Military Service in the Revolutionary War after 184 years. This headstone, complete with lettering, was received from the Georgia Marble Company.

A contact was made with the present owner of this particular property, Dale Burris of Oakboro, NC, who gave permission for this headstone to be installed. At 11:00 AM, May 5, 1995, Ronnie Burleson, my brother Aaron and Gretchen Burleson of Burlington, NC, JD & Karol Burleson, of Thomasville, NC, Thomas N. and Martha Clark, of Burlington, NC, Hoey & Stella Burleson Curlee, and Wilma Burleson Harris of Albemarle, NC, Hazel Burleson and I erected this headstone beside the slate marker, along with the Bronze Patriot Seal.

On May 28, 1995 the SAR Color Guard, dressed in Colonial Uniforms, comprised of Richard J. Moore, E.F. Sharpe, Nat Clark, and myself led the solemn Ceremony. The unveiling of the Marker was by Jerry Burleson and Christopher Burleson --5th & 6th great-grandsons; the laying of the Wreath was by Katie and Daniel

Burleson --6th generation grandchildren. (Randleman, NC)

Others participating in the Dedication were Dr. Charles E. Page, former Chaplain General of the National Society SAR, Mrs. Hazel B. Burleson, Regent of the Battle of Alamance Chapter DAR, Raymond Donnell, President of the Alamance Battleground Chapter SAR, and Thomas N. Clark, President of the NC Society SAR.

Refreshments were served to approximately 80 of the Burleson descendants and SAR participants.

Isaac Burleson – Revolutionary War Soldier

In the beginning of 1776 North Carolina had two major problems. First, the Cherokees to the west of the Blue Ridge and in the Smokey Mountains were on the warpath again. They were raiding the western frontier of Tryon, Mecklenburg and Rowan Counties. Secondly, the British were sending a fleet to Wilmington, North Carolina to rendezvous with the Scottish Highlanders who lived in Cumberland County and the Cross Creek area. They planned to put down the rebellion that had started in Mecklenburg.

In February 1776, General Griffith Rutherford commanded the Salisbury Military District. This included all the state of North Carolina west of the Yadkin River. He called for the militias to neutralize the Scottish Highlanders.

Captain Charles Polk called for his Clear Creek Militia Company of Mecklenburg County. On the roster was Isaac Burlison. This is the first document that I have for Isaac and we can trace him by documents through 1810. He is the founder of all the Stanly County Burleson Family. During the War the roster also included three signers of the Mecklenburg Declaration of Independence of May 20, 1775. John Foard, John McGintry, Charles Alexander, and James Jack who delivered the declaration to the North Carolina representatives to the Continental Congress in Philadelphia.




Additional Clear Creek Militia members included: Thomas Shelby who was a brother of Isaac Shelby of Kings Mountain fame and first governor of Kentucky and a friend of Daniel Boone; John Pusser who's descendants would settle in McNairy County, Tennessee. One became well known for enforcing the law with a big stick. His name was Buford Pusser. Tumus Hood was the ancestor of General John Bell Hood of the Civil War. The sons of James Jack served in the Texas independence struggle. Patrick Jack was imprisoned for his rebellion at Anahuac and after the war became a Supreme Court judge of the Texas Republic. William was a Private at San Jacinto, later served as Representative and Senator of the Republic. He was also the Secretary of State under President Burnet. Third son, James W. Jack, did not go to Texas but his only son James III did. He was one of Col. Fannin's men that were massacred going to the relief of the Alamo.

Another name on the roster is John Hunt, the founder of Huntsville, Alabama. Huntsville historians proudly point to John Hunt's Revolutionary War service under Captain Charles Polk. Everyone wanted to be part of this distinguished unit, but the historians have made a mistake. Hunt's name is on the paper not as one of the 39-militia men in 1776, but Hunt was the Administrative Officer who certified the company pay vouchers in 1779. While in Huntsville John Hunt was a contemporary of John Burleson, son of

Aaron and Rachel Hendrick Burleson. He was also the grandfather of John Hunt Morgan, the Confederate General.

Isaac served 26 days and was paid 2 pounds. and 12 shillings .The Cross Creek expedition climaxed with the Battle of Moore's Creek Bridge. It was the first complete victory for the Americans in the North or South. The army of Loyalist militia was composed of well-armed Scottish Highlanders; many of them were veterans of the Continental Wars. They were 1500 strong and had marched within 40 miles of the

coast when a Patriot army under Governor Caswell blocked the path. The frontier militia that Isaac was a part of chased the Highlanders into the trap. The fight lasted only an hour. The Highlander's losses were 40 killed and 850 surrendered. Patriot losses were one killed. After the Battle of Moore's Creek Bridge on 28th February 1776, the Patriots continued to Wilmington to oppose the British fleet that was to land troops and rendezvous with the Highlanders. Of course the Highlanders never came. The Frontier Army took possession of Fort Johnston on the Cape Fear River that protected the Port of Wilmington. 86 years later in 1862 Isaac's great grandson, Absalom Burleson, would stand on the same rampart of Fort Johnston that Isaac stood on and defend his new country from another foreign invader in the War of Northern Aggression.

The Mecklenburg militia was back home in March but before the end of the month Captain Charles Polk had raised most of his company again and added a few others. But this time as a company of horse not a company of foot. The mission was to destroy the Cherokee threat to the counties of Tryon, Rowan and Mecklenburg. The expedition was well documented and successful. The Cherokee were defeated and their towns burned all the way to Lookout Mountain. The Company served 53 days from March to June 1776, but Isaac does not appear on this roster.

I don't know why Isaac was not enlisted. Each soldier had to provide his own clothes, arms and horse. Isaac was a young man; maybe he did not own a horse. Another reason could be he had family (David and Moses) that had married into Indian families! Whatever the reason, there were still British Troops to fight. Within days of the raising of Captain Polk's new company, we find on 16 April 1776, Isaac Burienson enlisted in the Fifth Regiment of the South Carolina Continental Army. This information is from the book <u>Roster of South Carolina Patriots</u> by Bobby Gilmer Moss, 1983. The source is "List of North Carolina and South Carolina Troops and officers and men of Continental Organizations raised from more than one state 1775-1783", Washington D. C. National Archive, M853, Roll 16.

South Carolina had previously raised the 1st and 2nd Regiments from Charlestown to defend Charlestown. The 3rd was a Mounted Ranger Regiment that operated in upstate South Carolina. Ezekiel Polk was a Captain of rangers in the "new acquisition", York County Turkey Creek area. Ezekiel was a brother of Captain Charles Polk, General Thomas Polk, Col. William Polk and grandfather of the future president, James Knox Polk.

By April 1776 South Carolina realized that the War would require a different type of soldier. As the 5th Regiment was being raised from upper South Carolina and the Waxhaw, Mecklenburg area of North Carolina, the first requirement would be that each new soldier would have to be an expert rifleman. This status had to be tested and certified by the Company Commander. Living on the Frontier and already a veteran of the Cross Creek Campaign, I'm sure Isaac had no trouble passing the test. Normal enlistment in the Continental Line was for 18 months or two years. Pension applications I have viewed of other veterans reflect this.

The 5th Regiment was commanded by Col. Isaac Huger and was sent to defend the area north of Charlestown. I don't know how long Isaac Burleson served, but the 5th Regiment was surrendered along with 5,000 others at the fall of Charlestown on May 12, 1780. The surviving soldiers were paroled and sent home.

To distinguish between my Isaac of Stanly County and the Isaac of Monroe Tennessee, the latter was born between 1765 and 1770 according to the 1800, 1810, 1830 and 1840 census records. These are the complete census for Isaac of Monroe, Tennessee. On 16 April, 1776 I'm sure the 5th Regiment would not enlist an expert rifle man that was between 6 and 11 years old.

There is also an Isaac Burson who had service in South Carolina as an express rider with no dates given who can be traced to a separate Burson family. They had an established history with the spelling "Burson" apparently had no connection to us.

Revolutionary War pensions were given out for different degrees of hardships up until 1834. Isaac did not live long enough to apply so we do not have a better record of his service. While researching the connection of Thomas Cutbertson and Rachel, the daughter of my Isaac Burleson, I found the pension application for Thomas's father, William, who applied in 1832 in Burke County, North Carolina. William lived in Eastern Mecklenburg County during the war. His brother Moses was also in Captain Polk's Company. William's application is very revealing.

The pension statement was submitted by a friend or lawyer acting in William's behalf and states, because of his "extreme old age (92) he cannot recollect dates or the officers under whom he served." "From the circumstance of his living in Mecklenburg County in North Carolina (the seat of war) living the whole of

the revolution, he must have served often or been driven off...and there can be no doubt that he was on the side of the Whigs for all the old Whigs and Tories (alive) are known to this day," 25 October 1832.

The next documentation of Isaac that we have is the 1782 tax list for Montgomery County. Several land deeds show him on Little Bear Creek, the part that later became Stanly County in 1841. Isaac and his brother David were in Montgomery County in the 1790 and 1800 Census. By 1810, David and all his sons had moved to Tennessee. Only Isaac and his family remained on Little Bear Creek, and we are still there today.

Captain John Miller (The purchaser of the Burleson Improvements) was commander of the Turkey Creek Milita. He served under Col Edward Lacy also of Turkey Creek. Another Patriot from Turkey Creek was John Adair, later governor of Kentucky, who's descendants would marry into our Burleson Family. The Billy Hill was the grandfather of Confederate General D.H. Hill. The iron works located on the NC/SC line in York County produced rifles and cannons balls. By John H. Burleson

We can get a better perspective on his life, the troubles and triumphs he lived through.

This prayer by John Miller tells a great deal of history for him, and our Burleson family was a part of it.





The Burleson migration from Lunenburg County to North Carolina surely began in the early 1750's. The first deed that we have was to Aaron Burleson 1757 on the Savanah River in Georgia at the end of the Great Wagon Road. This Aaron lived out his life in Georgia and left a documented family there.

Next we have another Aaron on Dunham Creek in Cumberland County 1760. But many events happened before 1760 in North Carolina and the 1757 deed in Georgia. I took the book <u>Sunlight on the Southside</u> by Landon C. Bell and compared the names to the names in the book <u>North Carolina Land Grants in</u> <u>South Carolina</u> by Brent H. Holcomb. The reason I chose Holcomb's book was there are several references to "Burleson Improvements" between Love's and Burleson's fork of Turkey Creek. This property is between Turkey Creek on the Broad River and Fishing Creek on the Catawba River. This area is in York County, South Carolina today. But was once part of Anson County, then Mecklenburg County, then Tryon County, North Carolina. The reference appears several times and does not give us a first name or a date for settlement. But on 22 September 1766, John Miller applied for a warrant for 200 acres including Burleson's Improvements.

By asking for a warrant, which is the second step of three steps in obtaining a grant, proves that the property was never granted to Burleson. Did he die or move again before he asked for a survey and grant? We don't know.

In <u>Sunlight on the Southside</u>, 1748 on page 82 we find Aaron Burleson listed. His next door neighbor William Walker and his three sons John, Thomas and James are also listed. All three sons also appear in the <u>North Carolina Land Grants in South Carolina</u> book. John owned land on Fishing Creek by 1766, Thomas owned land on Fishing Creek in 1753 and James owned land on Fishing Creek by 1766.

Four names away is the Mobberley family. They established the Mobberley Meeting House on the Broad River just south of Turkey Creek.

On page 84 of the <u>Sunlight on the Southside</u> we find Jonathan Burleson, his two next door neighbors were Robert Russell and John Turner. Russell settled on Little River/Antiquorm Creek 1756, and Turner owned land on the Southside of the Catawba River.

For the year 1749 in the *Sunlight on the Southside* on page 101 we find John Burlinson. Three houses away we have John Dennis who settled on Fishing Creek.

For the years 1750 and 1751 we do not have any Burlesons listed in Lunenburg. In the 1752 list Aaron is not listed but his Walker neighbors are, in fact there appears another brother, Phillip. He owns land on Fishing Creek in 1753. Another next door neighbor, William Clark, according to <u>North Carolina Land</u> <u>Grants in South Carolina</u> says he moved to the Tyger River. Their next door neighbor is a William Bowles. I suspect, but it is not proven, that William is a kinsman of Suzie Bowles that the first Fork of Turkey Creek is named for. The middle fork is of course named Burleson Fork.

On page 205 of the <u>Sunlight on the Southside</u> we find John Burleson living in Jonathan Burleson's household. Just a couple of houses away we find Robert Russel again as in 1748, plus three new next door neighbors. They are John Williams that settled on the Pacolot River adjoining Twitty's land (Capt. Wm. Twitty was killed in 1775 – one of the Boone party on the Wilderness Trail), William Irvine who

settled between Love's Fork and Burleson Fork of Turkey Creek (this is the same description of the Burleson Improvements of Turkey Creek). William Irvine was also a friend of Boone as he moved his family to Boonesboro in 1781. The last neighbor was Christopher Irvine who was granted the Nation's Ford of the Catawba River 1753. Christopher, also a friend of Boone, was in Boonesboro in 1776.

It was not a coincidence that all these people moved from Lunenburg to the Broad River/Turkey Creek area. A phenomenal movement of the population from Lunenburg County happened from 1750 to 1769. A full 80% left the county. In 1752 in John Phelp's District there were a total of 177 names listed, 19 of these appeared later in the *North Carolina Land Grants in South Carolina* book. 13 of the 19 were close neighbors of Aaron, John, or Jonathan. Most of the neighbors settled with in twenty miles of the Burleson Improvements on Turkey Creek/Fishing Creek. Of the six that were not Burleson neighbors, three of them settled on Turkey Creek/Fishing Creek anyway. I think this was by design not chance.

It is sufficient to say that the area was first settled in the early 1750's. As the only road was the Great Wagon Road, the Creeks became the landmarks. The first settlers on a creek had the honor of having the creek named after him. Example: Turkey Creek had several branches, First Fork Suzie Boles Creek, named for Suzie Boles, 1753; Love's Fork, named for James Love, 1754; the middle Fork or Burleson Fork settled ????. I would suggest the years between 1752 and 1755.

Dear Beulah;

It was a pleasure talking with you by phone yesterday and learning more about the Burleson's of Stanly County North Carolina. Since I retired, about a year ago, I spend most of my time researching Burleson genealogy and visiting with those members of our family who still live near the homesteads of their ancestors. When I spent the day with Wm. Thurman Burleson last year we made a tour of 5 or 6 old Burleson cemeteries in Stanly County. Thurman is son of Grady N. Burleson and Connie Tebe Burleson., and has Burleson lineage on both sides; paternal and maternal. He is married to Mary Jewell HARWARD. (This surname is spelled HARWOOD in some of the Cemetery records), They have two sons, Ronald and Dennis, and one daughter, Loretta Burleson MORGAN, They are fine people and we enjoyed our visit very much.

One purpose of my call was to learn where you got the Burleson chart prepared by John Hill Burleson, which you gave to David D. Almond Jr., of Albermale. He sent a copy to me. This is the only record I have seen of the family of John Shipman Burleson and his descendants, and I want to learn the source of this chart if possible. According to the chart, John Hill Burleson had only one child, Ruth Burleson WOOLEY, who probably has his records, She was born about 1890-95. If you have her address, or that of her children, I would appreciate having it. They probably live in Texas.

From the information you gave me, I believe your grandfather was Howell Burleson, born 9 January 1845 and died 12 November 1904. According to my records, he married Judith BURRIS and their daughter, Lucy L. Burleson, married W. B. ALMOND. There is a tombstone in Burleson Cemetery #2 (Absalom Burleson Cemetery) for an, infant son of Howell and Julia Burleyson. Either JUDITH was also called JULIA, or Howell was married more than once. Would like to have your opinion on this.

The 1850 census Of 5tanly County lists Howell as age 5 in the family of William Burleson and Sarah. I believe she was Elizabeth Sarah HARWARD (or HARWOOD). The census record spells the name BURRELSON. This William was probably son of Isaac Burleson Jr., since Isaac and Catherine (CASTLE) BURRELSON are listed in the census record as living near this William, and give their ages as 66 and 60 (in 1850). William and Sarah are shown as 38 arid 40 respectively. Isaac Burleson Jr., is believed to be son of Isaac Sr., and Martha CLAY. Other members of Isaac Senior's family are:

- 1. Jonathan Burleson, 1791-1857, married Sarah ?____. Burried Waxhaw, NC
- 2. Jane (? Rachel) Burleson, 1792-1879, married William, Castle.
- 3. Isaac Burleson Jr, 1784-1863, married Catherine Castle
- 4. David Burleson, 1796-1883, married (1) Mary Ann Castle, (2) Elizabeth Brannon
- 5. Thomas Burleson, 1812-1880, married ?

There were probably other children and I would certainly like to find someone who knows more about this family of Revolutionary War soldier Isaac Burleson. An Isaac BURLENSON enlisted on 16 April 1776 in the Fifth South Carolina Regiment. We have records of Burlesons in York County, S.C., as early as 1760. In July 1785, an Isaac Burleson settled on land in Montgomery County, N.C., and applied for a grant. The location is described in the grant as being on the Yadkin River, Little Bar creek, "adjacent to his old line". This indicates he was in present-day Stanly County prior to July 1785. On 5 November 1794, he entered another grant for 100 acres on the west side of Pee Dee River on Little Bear creek.

Two other land grants in my records should interest you;

- File #303, Howell Burleson, 86 acres 8 April 1880 on Lick Branch, adjacent to William Burleyson (his father) and James Almond.
- 2. File #308, William Burleson, 27 acres, 18 March 1880 on Lick Branch adjacent to Howell Burleyson and James Almond.

Your grandfather, Howell, died three years before you were born. Do you know which of his children lived on this land after he died? I did not have time on my last trip to North Carolina to check the probate and land records in the courthouse in Albemarle. It would be nice if we could find someone still living in Stanly County with sufficient interest to copy <u>al1</u> the old Burleson records in the courthouse. Thurman is in poor health and his sons are too busy taking care of their 1600 acre farm.

From the information you gave me, I have prepared Family Group sheets on the families of your father, Allen Lee Burleson, and your grandfather, Howell Burleson. My records contain scant information on Howell. I believe he had a daughter, Lucy M. who married W.B. Almond. Their son, David Delmar Almond, was father of the David D. Almond, Jr., with whom I have corresponded and who is a member of Burleson Family Association. Another child of Howell Burleson, Anamelesson, died as an infant. If you can fill in other children and dates and places, I will be most grateful.. I am enclosing copies of these family sheets and several blank ones for you to use for the family of Lonnie Vann Burleson and any other families with which you are familiar.

As I told you, all records I obtain on the Burleson family are forwarded to the

Secretary of Burleson Family Association, in Arlington, Texas. One important function of BFA is to extract from living Burlesons and official records, all the information available on our history and genealogy. This is being published quarterly in the Burleson Family Bulletin. Since August 1981, they have published 255 pages of such information. It covers all branches of the family, including research on the family in England in the 16th century and the descendants of Edward Burleson, the first immigrant, who settled in Suffield, Connecticut during the 1660'so (We believe Edward was the first immigrant, but have not yet found him in England.)

The father of your Isaac Burleson Sr., is not known for sure. Most Burleson Historians, past and present, have believed he was a son of John Burleson, who was killed during the Rev. War. According to family tradition, John did leave a family. David Burleson, 1755-1832, is said to be another son of John. He died in Rutherford County, Tennessee and his descendants migrated to north Alabama, then to Texas. The estate of an Aaron Burleson was probated in Wilkes County Georgia in December 1783. Since he fits into no other family, we believe he was also a son of John and brother of your Isaac. I am descended from this Wilkes County Georgia, Aaron Burleson, and his wife, Martha "Patty" WILDER. My great-great grandfather, Seaborn J. Burleson, married Malinda WILDER in Henry County Georgia in December 1830. His father, Aaron Burleson Jr., migrated to south Alabama after the War of 1812, then into NW Florida. Several children of Isaac, migrated to Mississippi, then to Arkansas and Missouri. Those in Arkansas were opposed to slavery and fled to Missouri to avoid the Confederacy. Many never returned to the South, but they are prominent in the history of Missouri.



BURLESON FAMILY AND COAT OF ARMS

The Burleson family and the Burleson family name is of English origin, with the name being of the surname type known as an occupational name. The Old English or Saxon language had the word burle meaning "to dress or finish cloth" by removing the small burs or knots of thread sometimes formed in weaving. That produced an original name of Burle, and the son of Burle became Burleson. The name appeared in northern England near the Scotch border very early, for ancient English records mention a certain Hugo Burleson by the year 1202, and there is also mention of a John Byrleson by about 1210. That difference in spelling was often found in all family names. The Burleson family came to America prior to the American Revolution, and the Census of 1790 (the first census ever taken for the United States) listed

no less than six Burleson families in North Carolina. Two of those families, the families of David Burleson and Isaac Burleson, were living in Montgomery County in 1790, and they were in that area of Montgomery County which was later cut off to form the new county of Stanly.



The Burleson coat of arms follows:

ARMS: Per fesse; a fesse wavy gules, chief part vert, a lion rampant or; the base per pale. dexter side vaire, the sinisterside sable, three roses argent.

CREST A demi-lion rampant or, holding in paws a rose argent, barbed vert and seeded or.

Note: That description of the Burleson coat or arms means that the shield is per fesse (meaning divided into upper and lower halves), with a fesse wavy (meaning a horizontal band across the middle of the shield) which is of gules (red) color. The upper part of the shield above the wavy red fesse is of vert (green) color with a lion rampant (meaning a lion that is reared up on itshind legs) and of or (gold) color with red eyes and claws. The base or bottom part of the shield below the wavy red fesse is also divided per pale (meaning divided by a vertical line from top to hotroan). The dexter side of the base is of vaire (meaning of mixed silver and blue colors in sort of hat-shaped figures, the whole thing being a symbol of the very fine fur that was known as vaire and which was worn by members of noble or royal families in medieval times). The

sinister side of the base is of sable (black), with three roses of argent (silver) which have barbs of vert (green), and the seeds in the center are of or (gold). The crest above the helmet is a derni-lion or half-lion rampant or reared up and of or (gold), the lion holding between it paws a silver rose like those, on the shield. There is no motto, but earliest coats of arms had no motto, so its absence is proof of antiquity. The wavy red band across the shield is symbolic of sword belts worn by knights and fighting men. The lion on the shield and in the crest is a symbol of strength and courage. The vaire color in part of the base indicates some relationship, possibly by service or kinship, to those of high rank. The roses were symbols of beauty, grace, joy and hope. The colors of the arms also have meaning. Red is the symbol of courage and valor, Green is the symbol of charity, hope and sturdiness; black is the symbol of dignity, constancy and nobility; gold is the symbol of generosity and elevation of mind; and silver is the symbol of peace, innocence and sincerity. --- LUTHER N. Helpful Hints To Follow a Family Outline

This book and each of the previous books contains many "Family Outlines" (See ******* Example ******* below). These Family Outlines can be confusing and hard to follow at times. The outlines are printed out by my computer using a program called Family Tree Maker. It is a very good program and has been the central storage location for the BFRG research for 10 years. The Family Tree Maker program keeps each person's name in the right place so we can follow generation after generation. Below is a sample page. It can start with any individual. Each book will be different, but the numbering system is consistent.

Each book starts with the Descendants of the subject of the book and each of their children is listed in small Roman numeral, i.e., i, ii. Each book is divided into chapters, one for each child with descendants. The number to the left of the small Roman numeral is the number for more information on descendants' of that individual. In the sample below number iii, is Jonathan Burleson and the number 2 indicates how to find more information on his descendants. So when you go to number 2, you will find Jonathan Burleson and all of his known children listed the same way. Then you would go to number 7 to find more information on Dennis Clay Burleson's descendants. You can follow this numbering system all the way through the book. If there is no number to the right of a individual, such as i. Thomas Burleson that means that Thomas Burleson has no known children and that will be all the information listed for him. According to how large the generation is you may have to go several pages to find the next number.



Howell was the fourth son of William "Billie" and Sarah Harwood Burleyson of Little Bear Creek. On June 10, 1864 he was conscripted in the Junior Reserves to serve in North Carolina's defense. He was described as 5 foot 9 inches in height with blue eyes and fair complexion.

This 17-year-old fought in battles in Eastern North Carolina but in 1864 the war was not going well for the South and Howell was transferred to Virginia on December 20. He served in the 20th Regiment, Iverson's Brigade. The 20th was part of General Lee's Army of Northern Virginia. They served the Petersburg line until April 2, 1865 when the Union troops crushed the defenses and Richmond fell.

Howell returned home at age 18, a true veteran and ready to restart his life in Stanly County. In 1870 he was married to Judith Burris Almond, a widow of the War. They raised a large respected family and Howell and Judith were well known in the Canton Church area for their kindness and help to all of their neighbors. John Hoyle Burleson

Notes for JUDITH "JUDIE" BURRIS ALMOND:

Mrs. Judith Burleyson, widow of the late Mr. Howell Burleyson, died at her home in the vicinity four miles west of Albemarle on Saturday, January 19, at 9.45 p. m. For sometime she had been suffering from the effects of a cancerous growth, but only a short time before her death she contracted a severe case of pneumonia, which hastened the end. Her condition early in the day Saturday gave hopes for recovery; but a sudden change for the worse caused her death to come as a surprise and shock to family and friends, and she was unconscious when some members of the family hastened to her bedside just before her demise.

The burial took place at Canton Baptist church on Monday it 11 A.M., services conducted by Rev. A. C. Davis of Olive Branch, assisted by Rev. P. P. Walker of the local Baptist church. One of the largest crowds ever assembled at Canton church gathered to witness the last rites over the remains of a beloved

friend and neighbor. The deceased was born in this county on November 23, 1840, when the county formed a portion of Montgomery. She was twice married, her first husband, Mr. John Almond, having died early in the War Between the States. To this union, one son survives, Mr. James Almond. Eight sons and daughters were born to the second six of whom survive, Messrs. U.S., I.R., A.L. and D.R. Burleyson, and Mrs. Wm B. Almond and Mrs. Charles Burleyson, all of the county. Messrs. I.R. and A.L. Burleyson are highly respected citizens of our town.

The deceased, was all of "Mother" to her, children, and her great heart took in neighbors and their children, towards whom she could newer fully express her love, and it is in a multitude of kind ministrations in which she distributed joy to others that she will be best remembered. She was a Christian from youth, and death held no sorrows for her other than the parting with those she loved here on earth.

A member of the Baptist faith, she was a loyal devoted member to her church. There is an element of pleasure mingled with the sorrow one always, feels over the death of a person whose life has proved a blessing to others when chronicles of this nature are made out, and the Enterprise can hold out no greater consolation to the bereaved members of the family in a loss which they so potently feel at this time than comes from a memory of the sweet life which is left them as a heritage and an inspiration to so live that again they will see Mother and join her in the Great Beyond.



Judith Burris Burleson was a first cousin to Alexander Whitley who was lynched at Albemarle on June 9, 1892. Judith's father, Allen Burris was a brother to Alec's father, Joshua Christian Burris. *The Lynching Of Alec Whitley*, written by David Almond, a great grandson of Howell and Judith Burris Burleson, can be purchased at the Stanly County Historic Preservation Commission Office located at 245 East Main Street in Albemarle.

Here is essentially all the notes I have on Grandpa Allen Burris

Allen Burris, husband of Lucy Hinson Burris and father of Judith Burris Almond Burleyson, was a Justice of the Peace in Stanly County. It is likely for him (and Gen. Robert E. Lee) that grandson Allen Lee Burleson was named. The 1850 census notes that Allen Burris was a 42 year old farmer, and that in his household were 13 children ranging in age from 2 to 19 years. In 1860, Allen's farm was valued at \$800, and his personal property was worth \$600. Living at home with Allen and Lucy were Judy/Judie (age 17), Beady (age 15), Martha (age 13), James A. (age 11), Lucy (age 9), Margaret (age 7) and Martha (age 5). All of the Martha children except were attending school. Listed in the 1870 census is "Allen Burroughs", a 62 year old farmer. Allen's farm was valued at \$200, and his personal property was worth \$500. Living in his household were wife Lucy (age 61), daughter Lucy (age 18), daughter Margaret (age 17), son James (age 21) and Frances (age 25), wife of James. Wife Lucy, daughter Margaret and Frances (James's wife, also known as "Franky") could neither read nor write. Allen, daughter Lucy, and James

could read and write. James's occupation was "farm laborer". The 1880 census listed him as a 72 year old farmer, and Lucy was listed as a 71 year old who "keeps house". Allen's farm was valued at \$1,100 and it included 75 tilled acres.


Below is a portion of the will of Allen Burris.

Will Date: June 6, 1874 Probate Date: February 2, 1899

"... to my beloved wife Lucy a dower right of one third of my lands (and request that she remain and live with my son James A. Burris as long as she may live) for the term of her natural life ... a years support out of my personal prop-erty for the term of her natural life and direct my Executor to set it apart to her if she may so choose. If she desires to make any choice as to property she may do so but I request her to let every thing remain as it is until her death ... to my son James A. Burris ... my tract of land on which I now live containing 160 acres more or less which lands I bought from Daniel Freeman ... all the rest of my personal property and he is to assume and take entire control of the whole of my property and at my wife's death is to have all ..."

Executor: my son James A. Burris

Witnesses: Jno. C. Puett, J. T. Redwine, and J. M. Ross [will]; Wm. H. Hearne testified that J. T. Redwine "is dead", that John C. Puett and J. M. Ross "reside out of the county" and that he "is well acquainted with the handwriting of the said J. T. Redwine, having often seen him write, and that the name of the said J. T. Redwine, subscribed as a witness to the said will, is in the handwriting of the said J. T. Redwine". J. M. Ross "reside out of the said J. T. Redwine". J. M. Redwine and G. W. Huneycutt testified that they "are well ac-quainted with the handwriting of the said Allen Burris, having often seen him write, and that the name of the said Allen Surris". J. M. Ross acknowledged that he was a subscribing witness to the will in Cabarrus County on March 11, 1899. [probate]

And here's all I have on Grandpa Howell and Grandma Judith.

Howell Burleyson was conscripted into the Confederate army on June 10, 1964, at age 17. Due to his youth, he was assigned to the 70th NC Junior Reserves. After spending several months in a Richmond hospital, he was transferred to the regular army on December 4, 1864, and was assigned to the 20th North Carolina Regiment.

Howell Burleyson apparently received a land grant in 1880 ("Big Lick Branch"?), adjacent to James Almond.

"Stanly County Marriages 1851-1904" shows his name spelled "Burlerson" when he married Judith Burris Almond in 1870. The 1900 North Carolina census record shows his name spelled "Burlesson". When his son, Allen, married Lucy Herlocker in 1901, Howell's name (as father) was spelled "Burleyson," which was correct. Of all the children from that marriage, I believe Ulysses was the only one to retain the "y"; all others spelled it "Burleson."

The 1870 census shows Howell to be a 26 year old farmer, living with his new wife, Judith, age 27, and her son, James Almond, age 8, from her previous marriage to John Almond. Howell's farm at that time was valued at \$300, and his personal property was worth \$200.

A child born to Judie and Howell in 1876 [between Allen and Lucy] lived less than 3 months. His/her grave marker identifies the child as "Anamelesson" [A Nameless One].

The 1880 census lists Howell as a 34 year old farmer with 40 acres of tilled land. The farm was valued at \$500. That record lists Judie's name as "Julia". Neither Howell nor Judie could read or write. Also living in the home in the spring/summer of 1880 were the children. James, age 18, was single and worked on the farm. James could neither read nor write. Ulysses, 10, a son who could not read or write later would learn to do both very well. Ira, 7, a son; Allen, 5, a son; Lucy, 3, a daughter; and David, 1, a son. In 1880, Howell lived in the Almond township, and his neighbors were the families of Lucindy Almond, Noah Burleyson, Rebecca Mann and Lloyd Whitley.

Howell Burleyson was listed, along with Thomas Lambert and Eli Herrin, as a Magistrate for Township No. 5 in the 1884 edition of the STANLY COUNTY BUSINESS DIRECTORY.

In 1900, Howell was 57 and Judie, 59. Howell continued to farm. Still living in the home were sons, David and William, and daughter Maggie. All of the children in the home were single and worked on the farm.

A portion of Howell Burleyson's will follows.

Will Date: May 6, 1904 Probate Date: December 25, 1904

"... to my son D. Rutherford Burleyson, the south west side of my plantation, the parts known as the Ridge tract, and the land (42 acres) bought of Shem Burleyson, also about 6 acres from my home place, adjoining the lands of Allen Burleyson, at the west corner of my home place ... to the road that leads out to School house ... to my son Rutherford, one horse and one milch cow, or the value of same in money ... to my son Willie the remainder of my land, known as my home place and the lands bought by me that adjoin my home place ... to my son Willie one horse and cow, or the value thereof in money, also all my farming tools of every description, including wagons, buggies +c ... that all my sons have free privilege of using my shop and tools to do their repair work ... to wife Juda, one third of the land that I have already bequeathed to my son Willie, during her life time, and at her death, to revert back to my son Willie ... to my wife \$50.00 in money ... to my daughter, Lucy Almond, one hundred and fifty (\$150.00) dollars in money ... to my daughter, Margaret Burleyson, one hundred and fifty (\$150.00) dollars in money ... that my land is to remain in the hands of my boys during their life time, at their death, to their lawful heirs, and that my lands shall not change hands, except by heirship ... All the rest, residue and remainder of my estate, real and personal ... to my wife, my sons, Ulysses, Irenus Allen, D. Rutherford + Willie, and to my daughters Margaret and Lucy, each to share and share alike ..."



Ulysses Shakespeare Burleyson

August 8, 1870 - October 27, 1959

Ulysses Shakespeare Burleyson or better known as U.S. Burleyson or as Papaw to his grandchildren was my hero and my grandfather. He always reminded me of Abraham Lincoln, as he was a man of integrity and a man whose word was as good as any written contract.


As most men of his day, he grew up as a farmer and did not have the opportunity of advanced education. However, for as long as I can remember and from family stories, he was in a "learning mode". He shared his early knowledge as a schoolteacher at the Burleyson School, located in Stanly County near his home area of Bloomington. I am unsure as to the dates of his classroom service and assume that they may have been before his marriage on December 22, 1895, to Rosa Lillian Ann "Mollie" Furr, daughter of Aaron Furr and Sarah Leticia "Janie" Hatley. Judging from a picture of the schoolhouse, it was nothing fancy but typical of the small schools of that period.

He also operated a country store that was located in the Bloomington community. My mother – Judie Burleson Cree – remembers helping in the store. The store was later sold to his son, Theodore, but it burned a short time later with no insurance. He also farmed the land around his home for a number of years.

In the 1920s, he moved his family to Albemarle where he lived the remainder of his life. He continued doing light farming and kept some cows on his "Poplin Place" located west of Albemarle. In later years, he developed this property and sold lots that provided him with much of his income.

U.S. Burleyson was a dedicated Christian and a life long member of the Canton Baptist Church, located near his old home place in Stanly County. He was the author of *The History of Canton Baptist Church*, published in 1952. He continued to "learn" until the time of his death on October27, 1959. I still miss him. Photos from Bob Cree. He wrote a short paragraph about the bell and U.S. Burleyson, his grandfather. "Attached are two photos. One is of my Mother- Judie Burleson Cree- holding the bell that my grandfather Ulysses S. Burleyson used when he taught school at the Burleyson School. The other photo is of the bell alone. What stories the bell could tell if it only could talk. The bell now belongs to my sister Lynda Ann Cree Thompson who lives in High Point. She purchased the bell at the auction of the estate of U.S. Burleyson. Her only opponent in bidding at



the auction was Hobart Morton. Back at that time, the family would use others to bid so as not to keep "outsiders" from bidding. I remember that Quentin Lowder did the bidding for Hobart Morton but am not sure who bid for my sister. The bell sold for \$12.50 which was a lot of money in those days.



Another note about U.S. Burleyson, Sr., he built the brick house at 1433 Charlotte Road next to the old West Albemarle Elementary School. Guess that I am getting old for I remember them building that school. If you stopped by the house today, you would still see his actual signature in the cement at the end of the walk where it joins the public sidewalk. He always had a beautiful handwriting. I sure did not inherit this talent from him." Bob Cree

Visiting the Burleyson vineyard was always a highlight in my visit with my grandfather Ulysses Shakespeare Burleyson who lived in Albemarle, NC. Incidentally, Grandpa always spelled his name with a "y" although all his children dropped the letter.

The vineyard was on a hillside on a farm owned by Grandpa Burleyson that he called the Poplin Place. The farm was just west of Long Creek on what is now the Hwy 52 bypass but in those days, there was no bypass.

According to my memory, the vineyard was started in the late 1930s and was producing well until the time of World War II. U. S. Burleyson's son, Edward Macon Burleson, was key in its development but left the operation in

the early days of the war and was in the Army. At the same time, U. S. Burleyson's other sons were either in the military, in defense work, or just not available to work the vineyard which required much more work than most people realize. This left Grandpa as the primary care giver at age 72.

I remember during one of my visits that some of my Stanly County friends and I were going swimming in the Creek so Grandpa gave each us a bunch of grapes to take with us. While swimming, a neighbor (I guess for there were not many homes in the area) came by and accused us of stealing Mr. Burleyson's grapes. We never convinced him that they had been given to us. Incidentally, during that same swim, we saw a large (at least it was large to me then) water snake in the creek coming directly towards us. We all left as fast we could, crawled under a barbwire fence with one exception. One of the boys caught his pants on the barbwire and could not get loose. Finally with torn pants, he joined the rest



of us in flight. The vineyard went down rapidly with no one to give it the tender loving care it needed but while it was operating, I enjoyed every visit there. I always thought the grapes were for making grape jelly but later I learned that people bought grapes for other purposes.



She is the daughter of U.S. Burleyson (also a teacher) and Rosa Lillian Ann "Mollie" Furr. She was born February 1, 1909 at the home of her parents in Bloomington, Stanly County.

I am unsure of the location of her elementary school education but assume that it was in the Bloomington area. She graduated from Albemarle High School around 1926 and then attended Wingate Junior College, where she met her future husband and my Father- Archie Gilliam Cree. After graduation from Wingate Junior College she attended Catawba College and graduated there with her BA degree. She was the first in her family to graduate from college, which was most unusual in those days.



Her first teaching position was at the Ridgecrest School in Stanly County. She taught there for one school session and wanted "to see the world" so she accepted a teaching position in a one-teacher school in Delaware. She lived with the Reed family who resided near the school. Most days she walked from home to the school but at times, the family with whom she lived would take her. She would assign various boys to build a fire in the heating stove each day as well as to bring in the required wood. She taught all the elementary grades in the one-room school for one year.

An interesting side note: About four years ago, Mother, my wife-June, and I were talking about her teaching in Delaware, and she remarked that she felt she had not expressed her appreciation to the family she lived with during her teaching year there. My wife asked Mother if she had ever had contact with the family since those days and Mother replied that she had not. My wife picked up the phone, called information and connected with the family where she found both the host husband and wife were still living and, in fact, the wife answered the phone. Mother and the lady carried on a conversation as if they had been apart for only a few months but it had been approximately 69 years. Incidentally, Mother then mailed them a check as a token of appreciation for what they had done.

She left the Delaware teaching position and married Archie G. Cree on December 26, 1930. The ceremony took place at the home of her Father who then resided at 1433 Charlotte Highway in Albemarle (next to the old West Albemarle Elementary School which is now a school administration building). They located in Newport News, Virginia where Archie worked as a bookkeeper in an appliance business owned by his sister's husband. Their first child- William Robert Cree (me) was born there on May 9, 1932. Their other child- Lynda Ann Cree was born in Statesville, NC on January 31, 1939.

Mother did not return to teaching until approximately 1945, the year her daughter started school. She taught at the Winecoff School in Concord, North Carolina. When the family moved to Albemarle in 1948, she transferred to the Endy School located in Stanly County. Dad became an Associational Missionary with the Baptist in Stanly County and later relocated to several other communities. Mother continued to teach transferring each time that Dad moved. The locations included Oxford, NC, Whiteville, NC, and Monroe, NC. She retired from teaching in approximately 1971.

I always considered my Mother as a most dedicated teacher. I remember her sitting up late at night grading the papers her students had submitted that day. I knew my teachers did not grade all my own papers so I asked her why she checked every single paper. Her reply was that if I required the student to use their time to prepare the paper, I owed them time to correct it. She loved teaching but when asked recently if she wished that she could return to the classroom, she replied "no". She did not feel she could face the lack of discipline in today's classroom and the lack of parent support, which appears to be a major problem. I must agree with her.

Until the last few months, Mother has worked to keep her mind sharp even at the age of 92. She would work her daily crossword puzzles and always kept at least five library books on her table. While she continues to do some reading, it is becoming more difficult each day. I wish I could provide more detailed information but her memory is not what it once was. William Robert "Bob" Cree

EDWARD MACON BURLESON By Bob Cree

Edward Macon Burleson went by his middle name- Macon. He, as the other sons of Ulysses S. Burleyson, was capable of doing most anything that required mechanical skills. At one time in his life, he operated a vineyard, was a textile worker, owned his own trucking business, and did some farming among other things. Both he and his first wife Muriel Howard developed tuberculosis and spent time in a sanatorium in North Carolina. He recovered but the illness was fatal to her. Macon later married Mary Beatrice Smith, better known as Bea, adopted her two children by a previous marriage and had two additional children by her. He served in the US Army during WW II and was award the Bronze Star.

Sergeant EDWARD M. BURLESON, (34256546), (Tank), United States Army. For meritorious services in connection with military operations against the enemy on 16 April 1945 on Ie Shima, R.I. The amphibious tractor commanded by sergeant Burleson was carrying a load of ammunition and water to the assault elements of infantry troops. As he moved forward, Sergeant Burleson encountered heavy mine fields covered by enemy rifle and machine gun fire. Realizing the urgency of his mission, he dismounted from his tractor and, disregarding all enemy fire, led his vehicle through the minefields to the front lines. He unloaded his tractor and was ordered to bring up more supplies, as they were urgently needed. Sergeant Burleson returned to the beach, picked up another load, and again led his tractor back to the front lines over his previously established route. This courageous action established a mine free supply route for all following vehicles.

Birthday Writing August 8^t", 1949

Today Aug. 8, 1949 is my 79th birthday as I was born August 8, 1070. Yesterday all the children except Theodore and Macon set a fine dinner at Morrow Mountain in honor of my birthday. They gave a big cake of course with #79 on it. Also many presents were given me in spite of my protests hitherto fore. I am well but can tell that I am gradually slipping back. When I work I get tired quicker than a few years ago. Also my weight is getting less. This might be last August 8th, but I do not worry about it. At 16 (in the year 1886) I joined Canton Baptist Church and am still a member there. Never moved my membership - I joined while the first church house was used for services. It was a frame building, depoted with planks, an arbor top roof, never coiled.

All my eight children treat me very kindly, almost like I were a baby. I greatly appreciate this treatment. I enjoy life and try to be always conscientious. My Father, Allen Lee Burleson

Allen Lee Burleson carried the mail in the early days of 1910-1939. His route was #3. It was the longest one - 27 miles. Allen drove a horse and buggy over the dusty and muddy roads for years. When the roads were improved and the buggy was replaced by a car, there was much rejoicing.

Some incidents that I remember are:

- A balky horse kicked out of the harness, tore up the buggy and hurt my dad, then ran away.
- The hot brick wrapped in paper to keep his feet warm caught on fire and burned his lap robe.
- One time when he stopped at a mailbox to deliver the mail, a group of gypsies gathered around and tried to rob him of his moneybox. I was with him and I was very frightened. He did satisfy them with a little change. He often took me along with him when I was very young.
- During the heavy rains, often the water would flow over the bridges crossing the creeks and streams. One time my father started to cross a creek but the bridge was gone. Daddy grabbed his mail sack and clung to a tree limb. After climbing out of the water, he walked miles to get help.


There is a saying that *Hail, rain, sleet or snow the mail must go through.* And so it did. When his fellow workers complained he'd say, "There are others who would like to have your job."

Back then the law required mail carriers to resign at age 65. My father was born January 31, 1874 so he reluctantly gave up his job in 1939 and went back to farming. He died December 29, 1969 when he was 95 years and 11 months old.

GROWING UP ON GRANDPA'S FARM

When I was born in November of 1946, my grandpa, Allen Lee Burleson, was already seventy-two years old. He had already retired from delivering the mail on route number three and had moved back to the country near his childhood home. Grandpa Allen may have retired from public work; but not from farming. He helped my Dad, J. Edwin Burleson, clear new land to grow crops. The whole family would go to the fields to pick up rocks and roots. My Grandma Lucy would take one of her handmade quilts for me to take a nap when I got tired.



On the farm, we raised cows, hogs and chickens for meat, milk and eggs. We had an old mule named "Cake" to plow the garden. I can still remember the hams hanging in the smokehouse and meat in the saltbox. On a cold autumn day, we would kill a hog for food. Seems like every Saturday, my Grandma Lucy would kill a rooster for Sunday dinner. Early Sunday morning, she would stew the chicken to make a broth for chicken stew. Then she would roll the meat in flour and fry it. My Dad and I would try to get the chicken liver first. Grandma Lucy also canned the garden vegetables for us to eat in the winter.

Every spring we would sow flower seeds for lots of summer flowers. Grandma Lucy loved beautiful flowers. I loved to watch the butterflies among the flowers. In the springtime, kittens were born. We always had a pet dog and sometimes a bird or a turtle. There were always baby chickens, cows and pigs. Sometimes we would go to Lena Burleson's dairy farm and buy an extra calf to nurse the mother cow.

Grandma Lucy did most of the housework because my Mother (Ruby) worked third shift in the mill and helped with the farming. It was my job to help Grandma Lucy. I would help churn the butter and polish the furniture. I would help her gather the eggs. Sometimes Grandma Lucy would sell some of the eggs so she could buy some products from the "Raleigh" man. The "Raleigh" man drove an old station wagon loaded with spices, vanilla, lemon or other food flavorings and medical salves and ointments.

In the summer, Grandpa Allen would take us down to the sand hills to pick peaches. He always preferred the Georgia Belle peaches. My Mother (Ruby) and Grandma Lucy would can enough peaches to open a quart every day of the year. We also had bees for honey. Most of our food was home grown.

Food for the livestock was ground in the granary. We bought flour at the mill. My Grandma Lucy would make quilts from the flour sacks and sometimes she would make me a new dress to wear.

We didn't have indoor plumbing until I was about three or four years old. We drew our drinking water from the well in the front yard. We also carried the water to the barn for the animals. I can remember Saturday night baths in a tin tub beside the woodstove in the kitchen. After our baths, we would get into a cold bed and cover with lots of quilts; then my Grandma would tell me Bible stories and stories about her childhood. Sometimes my cousins, Judy and Charles Hahn, would spend the night and we would sleep on a pallet on the floor.

Grandpa Allen liked to go to bed early and get up early. He always said that he went to bed and got up with the chickens. One of Grandpa Allen's favorite jobs was to cook breakfast. Every morning he would bake a pan of biscuits. He was a good cook.

Grandpa Allen was always very good to me. When I was small, he would hold me on his lap. Then he would take an apple, cut it in half and take a spoon to scrape out the pulp to feed me. On a cold day, he would show me how to make popcorn balls. One time, I burned my hand on the stove and he carried me outside and placed my hand in the snow. This helped to take out the fire.

Many times, I remember Grandpa Allen laying down his newspaper to read me a story or play a game. He taught us (grandchildren) how to play a game he called "wet bird". Many Sunday afternoons, we would load up his old blue truck and go on a picnic. Grandpa Allen told me the names of the different trees, birds and wild animals. We had lots of fun.

Grandpa Allen loved to fish and hunt squirrels and rabbits. He taught me how to make a wooden trap to catch birds. Grandpa Allen did most of the carpenter work on the farm. When snow was on the ground, we would go rabbit tracking or set a rabbit box that he had built. Grandpa Allen told my husband, Michael Forrest, that he used to hunt for turkeys near Long Creek. He would put some grain on the ground and shoot a couple of turkeys with one shot.

On week days, Grandpa Allen would wear stripped coveralls to work on the farm. I had a pair of coveralls just like Grandpas'. One day my Mother was sweeping out the corn crib and I said "There's a mouse in my pants!". Sure enough, when my Mother unzipped my coveralls, out jumped a little mouse.

On Sunday morning, you would always see Grandpa Allen at church. He was a member of Canton Baptist Church. Grandpa Allen was on the building committee to build the new church in 1927. His father, Howell Burleyson, had been on the building committee to build the new church in 1887. This

church was used for forty years until 1927. The church built in 1927 was used until September 29, 1999 when it was destroyed by a tornado. I am glad that I have the memory of Grandpa Allen reading his Bible, studying his Sunday school lesson and attending church.

Neither my sister (Kathy Lowder) or myself can never remember Grandpa Allen ever saying a curse word. He would not use any tobacco products or drink any alcoholic beverage. Grandpa Allen loved for me to play hymns on the piano. One of his favorite hymns was "Oh, Come Angel Band".

When I started to school at Millingport in 1953, it was Grandpa Allen who listened to me read the Dick and Jane readers each night. He helped me learn my ABC's and to add and subtract. I could always count on Grandpa



Allen to call out my spelling words for me and help me with special school projects.

While I was growing up, I can never remember Grandpa Allen or Grandma Lucy taking a vacation. I think that Charlotte, N. C. was about as far as they ever traveled. We didn't own a television until around 1955 and we didn't have a telephone until about 1961. Around the year 1956, our house was remodeled and bricked. I always missed the wrap-around front porch; but, I loved my new bedroom.

In January, 1959, we celebrated Grandpa Allen's eighty-fifth birthday with a large birthday cake and eighty-five candles. Great-Uncle Ulysses and Great-Aunt Lucy, Grandpa's brother and sister, came to celebrate. Reverend and Mrs. Oscar Bolch came and Uncle Lonnie's family and Aunt Beulah's family came to wish Grandpa a Happy Birthday. We took lots of family photos and had lots of fun.

Never can I remember my Grandpa Allen not working hard. He drove the tractors to plow, plant, cultivate and harvest the crops. He helped to care for the farm animals and other chores. Even when old age caught up with him, Grandpa Allen tried to work around the house and be useful. I never remember Grandpa Allen being very sick until the last two and half weeks of his life. He was never very fond of going to a doctor. Grandpa Allen didn't believe in taking medicines. His formula for a long, healthy life was lots of fresh air and hard work. I remember that he drank a lot of milk and cream.

The afternoon that God called Grandpa Allen home, I was leaving my children, Angela and Todd, at their babysitters' house to go to work on second shift. As I was going up the steps, I lost my breath and thought that I was going to fall. A short while later, my husband, Michael, came to the mill to tell me that Grandpa Allen had passed away. Grandpa Allen had left this world at 3:45 p.m.. This was about the same time that I had lost my breath. Grandpa Allen was born January 31, 1874 and passed away December 29, 1969. He was



ninety-five years old.

For nineteen years, I lived in the same house with Grandpa Allen. Grandma passed away Lucy on Grandpa Allen's birthday in 1964. I am glad that my parents and grandparents always lived and worked together. My sister, Kathy, was born in August of 1953 and my brother, Dale, was born in March of 1957. Grandpa Allen and Grandma Lucy loved and cared for each grandchild. To me, Grandpa Allen was never old. I am so glad that I was raised on Grandpa's farm and was able to share his love everyday.



Pa & Granny's Cabin

Up at the River with Pa and Granny Burleson by Kay Almond Robbins

I reckon about the happiest times of my childhood were the many summer days and nights that I spent with my grandparents (Lonnie & Gertie Burleson) in a little one-room cabin on the Harper-Hearne lake near Albemarle. We always called it "up at the river." Life was simple then, with no electricity or running water. We went to bed with the sundown, to the sounds of crickets and the old Regulator pendulum clock on the porch, and listened for the whistle of the old steam locomotive engine as it came across the raised tracks to cross the water. We got up with the sunrise, or earlier, since Pa Burleson had to go to work at the American-Efird Mill in Albemarle, where he worked as a fixer. During the winter they lived in their house at West End in Albemarle, but when the weather got right they packed up and headed for the cabin.

Pa drove an old Army surplus Jeep. He had cutouts on the muffler that he would let loose when we got out of town, which was great fun for us passengers. When we reached the dirt road he'd also unlatch the canvas doors and they would flop around like elephant ears as we hit the curves and bumps and holes in the road. He did like freedom.... Sometimes he would pick me up in town and we would stop by the icehouse on the way to the river. When we got the big block of ice (or two) in the back of the Jeep, Pa would throw an old canvas tarp over it and let me sit on top. That was some real effective airconditioning!

Fixin' Things

Pa always did like to fix things, and I guess he could fix just about anything that needed fixin'. He also thought it was good to let children explore fixin' things. He had an old wind-up Big Ben alarm clock that he would take apart, and then he'd let us put it back together. It seemed like there were about a jillion pieces to that clock! With his help, I'd usually get it reassembled and running again in a few days.

Pa also liked to build things and grow things. I guess he could also build and grow just about anything he wanted to. He would always save his small scrap lumber pieces, and then he'd let us build our own "sailboat." These boats would be made of several short pieces of wood, stacked up with the biggest on the bottom and the littlest on the top, all nailed together. They sort of resembled a wooden rectangular wedding cake. We always made a little flag to fly on top, sometimes with paper and sometimes with cloth from Granny's scrap basket.

Pa was always building small boats for fishin'. One time when I was about five years old he let me choose the paint colors and help paint. I chose to paint the boat pink, with big brown

polka dots (my artistic flair was evident even at that age). He painted the pink part and I painted the brown dots. I wore out the seat of a few pairs of shorts sliding across the seat of that polka-dot boat to paddle

Granny's Leaf Hats

Granny Burleson showed me how to make leaf hats using the large leaves from what we called "bean" trees. We

would snap off short pieces of twigs to use as pins and fashion a widebrimmed sun hat with the big leaves. To trim these millenary creations we gathered all sorts of wildflowers and interesting vegetation. No two hats were ever alike. I wish I had some photos of those leaf hats.

When the weather did not permit us to go out in the woods and forage for leaves and wildflowers, Granny helped me to make "cloth pictures." She would cut an old sheet into pieces about twelve inches square. With crayons as my medium I would create masterpieces on the cloth. I almost always drew boats with bright colored sails. When I was finished with my art Granny would put the cloth picture between two layers of waxed paper and then iron it to set the wax. This was the beginning of my career as a maritime artist, I reckon. Nobody saved any of my cloth pictures I suppose – at least I haven't seen any in many, many years.



Memories

There were so many good times, and good things to do up at the river. I've only touched the tip of that iceberg here. It would take a whole, separate book to write about them all. Some of the experiences that I especially remember (not all of them good) were ...

- ... picnics across the "river," with a natural spring to keep the milk cold.
- ... Granny gettin' her fingers caught between two blocks of ice in the ice box.
- ... going with Pa Burleson early in the mornings to harvest the catfish on his trotlines.
- ... Granny's home-cooked "lard" biscuits that were about a mile high.
- ... sittin' up on the railroad tracks with Pa, catching fish.
- ... granny's fried apple pies.
- ... granny making me coffee (about a half inch of coffee and sugar in a glass of milk).
- ... camping out outside in Pa's Army surplus tents the kind that slept about six people.
- ... playing with cubed pieces of "Indian money" that we would find all over the ground.
- ... diggin' up fishin' worms from Pa's worm bed near the garden.
- ... eatin' fresh fried catfish and eggs for breakfast.
- ... hatin' the motorboats that started coming, messing up the quiet "naturalness" of that world.
- ... diving off the high pole on the end of Pa & Granny's long, long pier.
- ... Uncle Bob's big dog, Tinker, running off the end of the pier while chasing a butterfly.

Those were good times, the days and nights up at the river at Pa & Granny Burleson's cabin. I am so fortunate to have experienced them. I wish my children could have known them too





Steve's Parents

Elva Burleson Lambert, mother of Newell and Jewell Lambert died 4 months after their birth. Theodore Lambert was left with the twin infants and their two older sisters, and he recognized that he could not provide the level of care the babies would require as he farmed and reared his other daughters. Newell and Jewell were taken to live with Theodore's sister, Mornen, and her husband Ezra Cline Almond, whose home was about one mile away on the Canton Church Road outside of Albemarle, NC. Mornen and Ezra provided the love and care that their father had known would be given, and they later adopted the children.

Newell enjoyed the benefit of two sets of parents (Theodore later married Bertha Almond, Ezra's sister) as he loved and was loved by both. He grew up working on the farm and he enjoyed singing. His talent as a singer was recognized in his performances with the high school and church choirs, and as a soloist. In his 20s, he sang bass in a quartet with Roy Earnhardt, Billy Almond and Carroll Almond. The quartet made recordings of gospel songs on 78 RPM discs in 1947. Newell graduated from Albemarle High School and attended NC State College, but left before graduating to join the Army Air Corps as World War II was ongoing. It was not until then that he discovered his legal name had not been changed at the time of adoption from Lambert to Almond, the name he had gone by since his adoption. The change was made, thereby eliminating confusion in military records. It saddened his biological

father who had wanted his son to carry on the family name. Newell obtained the rank of 2nd Lt. and piloted a variety of aircraft all over the US, transporting soldiers and military cargo. After service, he worked with his Uncle Paul Herrin in a small furniture store. He entered Gupton-Jones College of Mortuary Science in Nashville, Tenn. and graduated to become a licensed mortician and funeral director. He joined the staff at Lefler Funeral Home, eventually becoming its manager.

Ramelle Burleson's family endured hard times during a portion of her childhood. She was the oldest of 3 children. At one point, the family had to move to a less comfortable home while renting their house to supplement a modest income. Her brother, Bob, spoke of lying in bed at night and seeing stars through openings in the roof. Ramelle was a talented basketball player in high school, she excelled on roller skates, and she loved to dance. She traveled the US in a '41 Ford as she followed Newell from base to base throughout the Air Corps years. At one point during the war years, she worked at a factory in Akron, Ohio building airplane parts and other hardware. On returning to Albemarle after the war, Ramelle worked as a bookkeeper at Southern Flour Mills. She went from there to a seamstress position (to which she commuted in Mt. Gilead, NC). Her skill with a sewing machine was great, and she made clothes for the family. She



later joined Lefler Furniture Co. as a bookkeeper where she worked for many years before taking a similar position at Jeffries Southern Processors. Ramelle's cooking was a delight...

memories of her fried potatos are dear. She loved chocolate and made chocolate pies often. She enjoyed grape juice and jelly, but could not tolerate the flavor or aroma of artificial grape.

Newell and Ramelle lived in an upstairs apartment at the home of Newell's adoptive parents after completion of his military service and after the birth of Steve. They built a house on Canton Church Road between and less than a mile from both sets of his parents on land provided by Ezra Almond. After about 5 years, they moved into an upstairs apartment at the funeral home, where they lived until about 1957, when they moved to a house at 825 North Fifth St. Newell had taken a new job as salesman for PAV Chemical Co., selling embalming supplies. They moved again in 1960 to the house owned by Ramelle's father, Lonnie Burleson (who preferred to live at his cabin on Harper-Hearne Lake), until the basement of their original house on Canton Church Road could be finished, and then they moved back there. Newell took a position as funeral director at a funeral home in Maxton, NC, and he, Ramelle and Kay moved to Maxton. Steve, who was in his junior year at Albemarle High School, continued to live in the house. Newell and Ramelle returned to Albemarle in about 1967, and lived in their mobile home (brought from Maxton) on the lot next to the house. Both suffered from alcoholism, which, no doubt, was a factor in their relatively early deaths (they were 47 and 50, respectively, at the times of death). Their children learned many things from them and much of it has been passed on to the grandchildren, one-half of whom they did not live long enough to know.

And your daddy and mother come back to see the body and your daddy said, your grandpa I mean, and your grandfather said to me; he said me and him was playboys, you know they played together, that's what he meant, he didn't mean the kind of playboys they say about today. *Tony:* Right.

Lilly: He meant when they was children they played together, they grew up together. And I do know who Jep's daddy's name, Grandpa Billie; that was my great grandpa; Grandpa Billie Burleson, and his daddy was named Isaac Burleson and he lived, well do you know where the Old Ruth -- well maybe you would say the Ruth Huneycutt place, but it was the June Burris place, years ago, and that's where the Isaac old place was at and he was buried out there in a (*See Recollections on page* 210 - 212) cemetery across from there, but Alf Huneycutt lived there and he had it all bulldozed down. And now that's about as far back as I can tell you of Isaac.

Tony: Right, Well I found out Isaac Burleson was my great-great-great grandfather.

Lilly: That's about it *Tony:* And Isaac Sr. was his father.

Lillie: Yeah, that's right. You know – I'm 84 year old and I just know about what Jep told me, an old bachelor man. *Tony:* Yes Ma'am. *Lillie*: What he told me. *Tony:* Yes Ma'am.

Tony: But I seen that Bible and I seen your name on the Bible and I thought that

Lillie: Oh did you?

Tony: Yeah, and I thought that you might could help me. Did you know Isaac's son, Joseph?

Lillie: Well let's see now. *Tony:* He had a son named Joseph.

Lillie: He did, and aint he the one, Isaac's son, Joseph, was in the war – the Civil War? Was that it?

Tony: He might have been.

Lillie: Uh huh.

Tony: I wasn't sure, but I know he had a wife, his wife's name was Lucy.

Lillie: Yeah, and he wrote a letter back here, to some of his family, and said tell them not to come there, it was so bad in the war. Now I don't have no idea, I couldn't get the letter for you -- I wish I could. But I don't know who's got the letter now. But he did do that. That was – see that was Jep's uncle, his father was Billie Burleson. But Billie had two sets of children you know, the first time he married (Sarah) Harwood, and uh - she died and left a family and then Grandpa Billie, he married Rhodie Springer and uh - had like Jep and Shem and he had twin boys, Shem and Hem.

Tony: Yeah, my dad remembered one of -- remembered them.

Lillie: I bet he did too. *Tony:* He remembered Jep too.

Lilie: Yeah, yeah, because Jep was always up at Sam's – they was always together. And uh – so that's about all I know, you know more that I do, I imagine..

Tony: Well you've told me a lot – what you just told me.

Lillie: Now Grandpa Billie Burleson, he's buried at Friendship.

Tony: Yeah, that's where I found Joseph.

Lillie: Yeah. *Tony:* That's where Joseph and Lucy are buried.

Lillie: Is that right? *Tony:* Yeah.

Lillie: Well, anyhow, back – oh maybe it's been 20 year-ago now – then we made up money, me and my husband and a few of us here round made up money and got him a little rock up there because he never had a little stone you know, at his head. And so that's why if you'd ever go looking for it, it's almost directly behind the church.

Tony: Uh, now what relation is your late husband?

Lillie: Well, I was a Burleson before I was married. *Tony:* Oh really?

Lillie: Yes, uh did you ever hear tell of a Reevus (Ireneus) Burleson that was a lawyer?

Tony: I don't think so.

Lillie: Well I'm sure your dad knew it, anyhow, that big house now that's for sale out there on West Main; that big old two-story house ...

Tony: Uh, okay.

Lillie: Well now, that, Reevus Burleson built that house. He was a lawyer there in Albemarle. If he was like me he wasn't much of a lawyer. And uh, he had a brother named Allen. He carried the mail on Route 3 for years and years in a horse and buggy. And uh, my husband was another set of Burlesons. I imagine though that we're really -- they was all related, don't you reckon?

Tony: Yeah. Yeah.

Lillie: Probably was. *Tony:* Yeah.

Lillie: Well listen, have you seen on channel 9 on television; this Burleson they are looking for? I forget now, in fact I didn't see what he had done. But anyhow he's wanted –

Tony: Ah – oh.

Lillie: He's no kin to me, I'm pretty sure. But anyhow I seen it on there and I'm pretty sure that I would know who his ancestors was because he looks just like them.

Tony: But I sure appreciate your help and ...

Lillie: Well I've – maybe I've not been much help to you.

Tony: Well, you said you knew Isaac and most people couldn't have said that.

Lillie: Well you know, let me tell you a little story about Isaac. Jep would tell me these stories, you know. See he lived here with us about eight months before he died -he had strokes you know. He was in the -- at that time it was the county home. And he was so dissatisfied we brought him here you know and took care of him until he died. He said that old man Isaac lived over there – do you know where that place is at – the Ruth Honeycutt place? A house back over there. Alf lived in it. And I don't know one of the Honeycutts lives in it now. It's back of the Joney Love place; back down from Alley Burleson place. Well anyhow, the old man Isaac lived there and they said his wife had a churn of milk you know, setting by the fire; fireplace you know, souring it to churn. And said his daughter's all dressed up you know and he knowed that theys gonna some boys is coming there to see her and he got so mad about it; said he

grabbed up the churn and held it high as he could in the air and dropped it. Said his wife said she grabbed up the butcher knife and threw it at him and said it done went right in the door jam – said if it had a hit him it would have killed him. The way Jep would tell it, it would just kill him just dead as hell. It probably would. If you'd ever, if you'd never known Jep Burleson you sure missed something. *Tonv:* Yeah.

Lillie: He could tell some tales. See, he knew all them old things.

Tony: Yes. Well ma'am I sure appreciate it and ...

Lillie: Well, yeah, I tell you what – them Bibles was here and they was doing nobody no good and theys like I told you, I'm 84 year old and when my, if I'd a died why probably they'd a throwed down the ditch and burned 'em – nobody wanted them and I decided that was the best thing I could do -- was just to give them to the library. *Tony:* Right

Lillie: Cause they'd be preserved there. *Tony:* It sure helped me out some.

Lillie: I'm glad you saw it. So you're -- now Thurmond Burleson – did you ever know him?

Tony: Thurmond? *Lillie:* Uh huh. *Tony:* No, but I've heard of him.

Lillie: He's dead now but he was getting up all that Burleson stuff.

Tony: Yeah, yeah I went to visit his wife and ask her about some of it.

Lillie: Uh huh, yeah. *Tony:* He's done a lot of research.

Lillie: He really did. He'd come here on Sunday and my husband was living at that time. And me and my husband and him and his wife, we'd go out ahunting up things like that you know. I guess he found a lot of stuff like that.

Tony: I was talking to Alvin Burleson and he's done some research.

Lillie: Yeah.

Tony: He said his, uh, his – I guess his it was his great-great grandfather was Lee.

Lillie: Yeah. Tony: Isaac's son. Lillie: Uh huh.

Lillie: Well now that's the gang that my husband was in – Sim Burleson.

Tony: He lives over there on Odell . . . *Lillie:* Odell road.

Tony: Yeah.

Lillie: Yeah, now did you ever hear about this? Now old man Howell Burleson and let me see now if I can think of some of the other's names – you know what, after you get old you can forget things. *Tony:* That's right.

Lillie: And anyhow they had a brother named William – did you ever know Harvey Burleson then – that was their grandpa. Well anyhow this William married, you know in that day there was no social security nor welfare nor nothing like that. And this William, he was about 22 year old or 21 or something like that when he died. But anyhow he was married and had two little children – two little boys – Gus and Jim was their names and see he had -- his wife – I don't know where she stayed – whether she went back to her mother or whatever, where she stayed at, her and the little boys – but his brothers would keep him two weeks at the time you know and old man Ab Burleson; his name was Adam or Absalom, and they called him Ab, lived down here just not far from me. And uh they'd carry him from one house to the other you know when their time was up keeping him they'd carry him to the next house you know. He had cancer in his back and they said they was two men a carrying him in a straight chair –you know what they call a straight chair, like an old kitchen chair you know with no arms to it.

Tony: Yes ma'am.

Lillie: And uh, they was carrying that chair -- and they was carrying him from Grandpa Howell's over yonder – that was my grandpa – down there to Absalom's and they's over yonder a little knoll; it's a little cemetery's (See Recollections on page 223 – 224) over there right now. I go over there once in a while, not often, because they don't keep it cleared off like they ought to. And uh, they got to this little knoll you know just a little hill like in the field and they had to set down to rest you know. Two men would carry him then two more would carry him a piece. And he told them, he said the breeze was a blowing pretty and he said that's where I want to be buried. And he was the first one ever buried in that little cemetery. His name was William – William Burleson.

Lillie: I went with a woman over there one time and she took all that down you know. Uh the last one was buried there was just a few year back – a man (Monte Burleson) wanted to be buried there and that's where they buried him. *Tony:* Yeah. *Lillie:* Course he was a Burleson too. Tonv: Yeah. *Lillie:* You know they was a time when I was a growing up – was a little girl; why you could come out in this community and you have said hey Mr. Burleson and you'd have got the right name. Everybody wants to know why me and my sisters married Burlesons I said well that was in the horse and buggy days and they was nobody else, we didn't see nobody else. Tony: Yeah. Lillie: But Burlesons *Tony:* I believe my dad would be – it'd interest him to talk to you – about some of these stories.

Lillie: Well I could sure tell him

Tony: There's a lot he don't know; he didn't ask, he didn't ask his dad a whole lot he don't know a whole lot about this family and all.

Lillie: Yeah, yeah you know Jep he stays here and he would tell those stories well then see he growed up -- we growed up with Jep – just right here at us. Tony: Yeah.

Lillie: And he'd; that's all he thought about, was old times and my daddy was named Rutherford. I live on the Rutherford road. Tony: Right.

Lillie: And uh, my daddy you know, he didn't like that. He said all Jep studies is done past and he wanted to know what was gonna be in the future. We had a lot of fun with that. Yeah I bet your dad would like to hear me tell about Jep, if he knew Jep.

Tony: . . . talk about Jep. *Tony*: yeah he knew about Jep; he heard his dad talk *Lillie*: Yea *Lillie:* Yeah, veah. Well, they'll never be another 'un. Naw, they'll never be another 'un. I had him buried over here at Canton Church. My brother put up a little stone for him. They'll never be another Jep. He was as queer as the dickens. *Tony:* Yeah, my dad's grandpa was Weddington. Tony: Yeah:

Lillie: Yeah, Wed and Aunt Teen; we called her Aunt Teen you know.

Lillie: Yeah, and you know before Benton Gaston died - you might a knew this --

Tony: Yeah, I knew, yeah.

Lillie: Well they told how many people had died in that house. You know I hate to see that house tore down. They told how many people had died in that house –something like about 15. I wouldn't stayed all night there – you couldn't chained me there. Tony: Ah.

Lillie: I'm scared of dead people.

Tony: Yeah.

Grandpa Billie's Bible

My first impression of viewing the Bible that belonged to William Burleyson was that the information inside could answer many questions. This proved to be the case only in a few entries. I had hoped to find a chronological order of the birth and death dates of Billie's first and second family or others, but what I found was quite different.

For the physical characteristics, the Bible is about 5 inches wide by 8 inches tall and was published in 1847. Today it is in remarkably good condition. There is little wear or tear for a new Bible, much less one that is 155 years old. This fact alone is enough for me to believe that it belonged to Grandpa Billie.

The entries in the Bible appear to be made by several different persons. Three I can identify by their statements in the Bible.

I believe Billie himself made the first entry. It is in very nice, impressive handwriting using ink that has smeared and turned brown over the years. This entry is on the front inside cover page. He records the birth and death dates of Isaac and Katherine Burleyson and continues to say, "Rote by their son Wm. Burleyson."

On a page at the beginning of the Gospel of Matthew, in the same nice handwriting, Billie records his birth date. Directly above this is the same listing, only it is "rote by Jap". The quality of this handwriting is considerably less. Japethy had custody of this Bible so his entries could have been made up until 1953. I find no entry dated after 1893.

There are two entries I believe that Reubin wrote. One is when he wrote down how old he was by the number of years, 19, and how many months, 2. He finished by saying this is the 20" day of February 1884. The practice of numbering the years, months, and days for a person's age was common of the period to be cut onto the tombstone. Reubin was doing this in a Bible three years before he died. From the math problems that are made randomly on these and other pages, I believe Reubin was making this entry as no one had kept up the book since Billie's original entry. Reubin's other signed entry is a quote or verse from somewhere. It starts, "If any man should add to this..." and is signed Reubin Burleyson, Seribling 1884.

By these two entries I can only guess that Reubin was possibly sick and was afraid of not being remembered so he made the entries for his own immortality. He would surely die on 21'' of November 1887.

All the other entries could be by these persons or anyone else. They contain birth dates of all of Billie and Rodv's family, but not in order and along with some other information.

The new information for me is the death dates of Katherine and Reubin. Also the confirmation of Billie being the son of Isaac and Katherine exists no place else that I know of The selected verses, numbered by hand, (approximately 1 through 25), mostly Psalms, is the only sign that any text page had ever been used.

Elizabeth Almond's death date is listed beside Billie's sister Dovey Harwood's death date. The mystery continues for me to identify who Elizabeth is. Could she be a sister to Billie or just someone that died the same year as Billie's sister Dovey in 1893? I would suppose she is family, but how close? Could she be the mother of Sara Anne Sides, wife of Absalom? We'll just have to keep digging!

Here is a story written by John Hoyle Burleson about James Almond and how he is connected to the Burleson Family.

James Almond's parents were John and Judith Burris Almond. Judith's father was Allen Burris, a grandson of Solomon Burris who was a Stanly County Revolutionary Soldier. Judith was born November 23, 1840 in Stanly County. She married John Almond on Feb. 2, 1861. John was the son of John Kellis (Jack) Almond (1800-1859) and his wife Sarah (born 1800). With this couple we have a mystery as to the certainty of their line of ancestors.

The Almond genealogists have a pretty complete lineage of four of the original brothers in Stanly County. John Kellis' age puts him in the second generation. I can't prove where he fits at this time. I think it is most unusual that of the three Almond families that are not positively placed into a known group, all three are linked closely with our Burleson family.

John Kellis wife is Sarah. Many Almond researchers have her as a Burleson. If this is so she must be a daughter of Isaac Sr. This could very well be.

Isaac Sr. and wife, Martha, had two daughters born between 1800 and 1810. If all the females listed in Isaac and Martha's home are their daughters, there are seven total. We need more facts to identify them at this time.

Well, back to John and Judith. As the War came to Stanly County in 1861 many joined the service of our Confederate States. As a newlywed John waited until August 8, 1862 to join the 5th Regt. Co. F. Leaving home for the first time was an ordeal for most of our Stanly County farm boys. The letters of Simeon Morton, a neighbor of John and Judith, give us some insight of this new experience. His letters to home after the fray of battle, show only the harshness of the war. But the first couple gives us an insight of what was to come. I will condense the writing of his first couple of letters that mention John Almond and others from Stanly County.

Simeon Morton's letter dated August 13, 1862 tries to comfort his wife Sarah and children. An interesting statement is, "If any of our friends come up to see us, you come with them to Salisbury and fetch as many of the children with you as you can to see the train cars." Apparently he had never seen a train before. He also gives some news of his fellow enlistee; "J. Almond, G. D. Whitley and William Dick appears to be doing very well," R. Dick is not. Of these men two would not come home, one was wounded and one was a P.O.W. Simeon himself died in Winchester Virginia.

A Crowd of friends and relatives that filled the Canton church to overflowing paid final respects Sunday morning to Wade, 20-year-old son of Mr. and Mrs. James Almond, who died in a local hospital last Friday afternoon from injuries sustained when a tree which he and two companions had just cut down rebounded and fell across his body.

Almond made a jump to clear himself, a briar caught his foot and tripped him and before he could move the tree had fallen across his hips.

Almond was employed by Jap Hatley, local contractor, and was one of the most popular young men in his community. His was the first death ever to occur in his family, there being 15 chil-dren-five boys and 10 girls. Rev. Lum Huneycutt conducted the funeral service. It was estimated that a crowd of two or three thousand people attended the service.

Young Almond is survived by his mother and father and the following brothers and sisters: Howell, E. D., Watt, and Ellis, a resident of East Spencer. All of the sisters except one are married. They are as follows: Miss Necie, and Mesdames H. E. Almond and with two relatives, Henry and Ollie Almond, had just cut down a good sized tree and it had fallen to the ground. 


